Absentee Ballots

Voters in McClain County who want absentee ballots mailed to them for the **August 27**th Runoff Primary Election should apply now with the McClain County Election Board.

Absentee ballots are available to all registered voters, provided they are eligible to vote in the elected requested. No excuse is needed to vote by absentee ballot.

The deadline for requesting an absentee ballot is 5:00 pm, Monday, August 12th.

Voters can submit a request using the OK Voter Portal at Oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp. Requests forms are also available at Oklahoma.gov/elections and at the County Election Board Office located at 121 N. Second Avenue, Purcell.

Five Tribe Wildlife Management

The Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes announced the Five Tribe Wildlife Management Reciprocity Agreement permitting hunting and fishing licenses issued through each tribe to be recognized by the other tribes that are party to the agreement, all on respective reservation land.

Tribal members and citizens of the Cherokee Nation, Chickasaw Nation, Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma, Muscogee Nation and very soon the Seminole Nation can utilize their tribal membership to enjoy hunting and fishing in participating tribes' treaty territories.

State game wardens cross-deputized with the respective tribes can ticket and enforce laws on these reservations, as well.

Shop Local

Here's what happens when you "shop local."

- 1. For every \$100 you spend at locally owned businesses, \$68 stays in Blanchard. What happens when you spend that same \$100 at a national chain? Only \$43 stays in the community*.
- 2. You wouldn't want your house to look like everyone else's in the U.S. So why would you want your community to look that way?
- 3. Local businesses are better at creating higher-paying jobs for your neighbors. When you shop locally, you help create jobs for firemen, police officers, and many other essential professions.
- 4. Buying from a locally owned business conserves energy and resources in the form of less fuel for transportation and less packaging.
- 5. Local business owners know you, and you know them. Studies have shown that local businesses donate to community causes at more than twice the rate of chains.

Sales Tax Holiday

Oklahoma's annual sales tax holiday will begin at 12:01 am on Friday, August 2, 2024 and ends at 12:01 am on Sunday, August 4, 2023.

Certain clothing and shoe purchases are exempt from sales tax for this time period only. Qualified items are exempt from state, city, county and local municipality sales taxes.

Retailers are required to participate and may not collect state and local sales or use tax on most footwear and clothing that are sold for less than \$100 during the holiday.

Tall Weeds & Grass



The City of Blanchard is committed to adopted regulations concerning the abatement of tall grass, weeds and trash.

The Blanchard Municipal Code concerning public nuisances and property enhancement requires that owners or responsible persons of property located within the municipal city limits are prohibited from allowing debris, junk, waste or trash to accumulate, or weeds or tall grass over twelve (12") inches in height, dead trees, bushes, and shrubs to grow or

stand upon the premises. This regulation is based upon the Oklahoma State Law Title 11, Section 22-111 which sets forth the procedure and definitions for the cleaning and mowing of property.

Property that abuts against public property (ie: alleys, streets, etc.) are responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of mowing of tall weeds and grass, trees, etc.)

Water Rationing

REMINDER! The City of Blanchard receives 100% of our water from the City of Oklahoma City. As a result, we are on a full-time water rationing of odd-even days, as required by our Agreement with Oklahoma City.

This means if your address ends in an even number then you can legally water on the 2^{nd} , 4^{th} , 6^{th} , 8^{th} , 10^{th} , 12^{th} , 14^{th} , 16^{th} , 18^{th} , 20^{th} , 22^{nd} , 24^{th} , 26^{th} , 28^{th} , and 30^{th} of each month.

If your address ends in an odd number, then you can legally water on the 1^{st} , 3^{rd} , 5^{th} , 7^{th} , 9^{th} , 11^{th} , 13^{th} , 15^{th} , 17^{th} , 19^{th} , 21^{st} , 23^{rd} , 25^{th} , 27^{th} , 29^{th} , and 31^{st} of each month.

Weatherization Assistance

PSO offers to its customers a 'Home Weatherization Assistance Program'.

Homeowners and renters with an annual household income of \$55,000 or less in a home less than 2,200 square feet and built prior to 2010 may be eligible for FREE home upgrades such as attic insulation, air and duct sealing, and more.

PSO's service provider, Titan ES, will perform an energy assessment at your home. If your home qualifies, Titan will schedule and complete the necessary home upgrades.

The services are completed at NO cost to you. PSO pays Titan ES for any approved upgrades completed on you home.
