A RESOLUTION APPROVING A THIRD RENEWAL AND MODIFICATION OF CONTRACT FOR SOLID WASTE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL CONTRACT.

WHEREAS, The City contracts its solid waste collection and disposal services to an outside contractor; and

WHEREAS, Waste Connections of Oklahoma, Inc. (the Contractor) is requesting a Third Renewal and Modification of the solid waste collection and disposal contract for a 5-year period and a rate increase of approximately 2.6%; and

WHEREAS, it appearing reasonable for the City of Blanchard, through its Municipal Improvement Authority (a Public Trust), to approve and execute the Third Renewal and Modification of the Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Contract, as presented; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority (BMIA) that such renewal and modification be entered and that a copy of same be hereto attached and made a part hereof by reference, all as provided by law and this Resolution shall be APPROVED and ADOPTED this 27th day of April, 2021.

THIRD RENEWAL AND MODIFICATION OF CONTRACT SOLID WASTE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL CONTRACT

THIS THIRD RENEWAL AND MODIFICATION OF CONTRACT, (this "Third Amendment"), is entered into this ______ day of April, 2021, by and between Waste Connections of Oklahoma, Inc. (the "Contractor"), and the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority (the "Town" or "BMIA").

WHEREAS, the Town and Contractor entered into that certain Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Contract dated May 12, 2009_(the "Original Contract"), as amended by that certain Renewal and Modification of Agreement dated May 26, 2015 (the "First Amendment"), and that certain Second Renewal and Modification of Agreement dated _February 23, 2016 (the "Second Amendment", together with the First Amendment and the Original Contract collectively referred to as the "Contract").

WHEREAS, the Town and the Contractor mutually desire to amend the existing Contract as further described herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, and in consideration of these premises and such other lawful consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which each of the parties hereto acknowledge, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Term</u>. The Town and the Contractor hereby agree that the term of the Contract is hereby extended for another five (5) years from July 1, 2021, up and through June 30, 2026 (the "<u>Second Extended Term</u>"). All of the terms of the Contract shall be applicable in all respects to the Extended Term except as specifically set forth herein.

2. <u>Rates. Exhibit A</u> to the Contract is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto as <u>Schedule 1</u>. The rates on <u>Exhibit A</u> shall be effective as of the beginning of the Second Extended.

3. <u>Rate Increases</u>. Beginning on the first day of the Second Extended Term, Article XI(8) and Article XI(9), and any other provision in the Contract relating to rate adjustment language shall be deleted in its entirety and the following shall be inserted as Article XI(8) and Article XI(9):

"8. Rate Increases. On every anniversary date of this Agreement, starting on July 1, 2022, the rates set forth in Section 9 above shall automatically adjust based on the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index ("CPI"). "CPI" as used herein shall mean the revised Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers (CPI-U), all items included, for the U.S City Average Consumer Price Index (CPI-U) rate based on the latest available figures from the Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. The CPI's so used in each such adjustment will be those CPI's so published by such governmental authority during the preceding twelve (12) month period. The amount of increase or decrease for such adjustment shall be an amount equal to the percentage of the then existing rates which such CPI has so increased (or decreased, as applicable) for the 24-month period ending with the month for such CPI's so published are utilized; provided, however, that (i) the rates shall not fall below the initial rates provided in Section 9 above, and (ii) the

percentage increase pursuant to this Section 10.A. in any twenty-four (24) month period shall not exceed three percent (3%) over the then existing rates so increased.

4. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Third Amendment may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which shall collectively constitute one and the same instrument representing this Third Amendment between the parties hereto, and it shall not be necessary for the proof of this Third Amendment that any party produce or account for more than one such counterpart. Facsimile signatures shall he given the same force and effect as original signatures and shall be treated for all purposes and intents as original signatures.

5. <u>Ratification</u>: All terms and provisions of the Contract not amended hereby, either expressly or by necessary implication, shall remain in full force and effect. From and after the date of this Third Amendment, all references to the term "Contract" in this Third Amendment and/or in the Contract shall include the terms contained in this Third Amendment.

6. <u>Conflicting Provisions</u>. In the event of any conflict between the original terms of the Contract and this Third Amendment, the terms of this Third Amendment shall prevail.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN AGREEMENT FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES.

WHEREAS, The City and the BMIA employs Glenn Sullivan & Associates, Inc. as their consulting engineering firm; and

WHEREAS, GSA has proposed an agreement to perform the various professional engineering services in the amount of \$50,000 for the design and construction of a new SW 7th Street Lift Station; and

WHEREAS, it appearing reasonable for the City of Blanchard, through its Municipal Improvement Authority (a Public Trust), to approve and execute the proposed Agreement for Engineering Services, as presented; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority (BMIA) that such engineering services agreement be entered into and that a copy of same be hereto attached and made a part hereof by reference, all as provided by law and this Resolution shall be APPROVED and ADOPTED this 27th day of April, 2021.

AGREEMENT FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES

This Agreement, made this <u>27th</u> day of <u>April</u>, <u>2021</u>

by and between the **City of Blanchard/Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority**, hereafter referred to as the OWNER, and **Glenn Sullivan & Associates, Inc.**, hereinafter referred to as the ENGINEER: THE OWNER intends to construct a **New SW 7th Street Lift Station** in **McClain** County, State of Oklahoma, for which the ENGINEER agrees to perform the various professional engineering services for the design and construction of said system.

WITNESSETH:

That for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises between the parties hereto, it is hereby agreed:

SECTION A - ENGINEERING SERVICES

The ENGINEER shall furnish engineering services as follows:

1. The ENGINEER will furnish a topographic survey of the existing site as well as the new site and will provide a legal description of the new site, if required. The ENGINEER will complete the detailed design of the project (including electrical and structural if required), prepare construction drawings, specifications, and contract documents, and prepare a final cost estimate based on the final design for the entire system. It is also understood that if subsurface explorations (such as borings, soil tests, rock soundings and the like) are required, the ENGINEER will furnish coordination of said explorations without additional charge, but the costs incident to such explorations shall be paid for by the OWNER as set out in Section D hereof.

2. The contract documents furnished by the ENGINEER under Section A-1 shall utilize funding Agency endorsed construction contract documents, including funding Agency General Conditions, Contract Change Orders, and partial payment estimates, if required. All of these documents shall be subject to funding Agency approval.

3. Prior to the advertisement for bids, the ENGINEER will provide for each construction contract, not to exceed 10 copies of detailed drawings, specifications, and contract documents for use by the OWNER, appropriate Federal, State, and local agencies from whom approval of the project must be obtained. The cost of such drawings, specifications, and contract documents shall be included in the basic compensation paid to the ENGINEER.

4. The ENGINEER will furnish additional copies of the drawings, specifications and contract documents as required by prospective bidders, material suppliers, and other interested parties, but may charge them for the reasonable cost of such copies. Upon award of each contract, the ENGINEER will furnish to the OWNER up to five sets of the drawings, specifications, and contract documents for execution. The cost of these sets shall be included in the basic compensation paid to the ENGINEER. Original documents, survey notes, tracings, and the like, except those furnished to the ENGINEER by the OWNER, are and shall remain the property of the ENGINEER.

5. The drawings prepared by the ENGINEER under the provisions of Section A-1 above shall be in sufficient detail to permit the actual location of the proposed improvements on the ground. The ENGINEER shall prepare and furnish to the OWNER without any additional compensation, up to three copies of a map(s) showing the general location of needed construction easements and permanent easements and the land to be acquired. Property surveys, property plats, property descriptions, abstracting and negotiations for land rights shall be accomplished by the OWNER, unless the OWNER requests, and the ENGINEER agrees to provide those services. In the event the ENGINEER is requested to provide such services, the ENGINEER shall be additionally compensated as set out in Section D hereof.

6. The ENGINEER will attend the bid opening, if requested, and tabulate the bid proposals, make an analysis of the bids, and make recommendations for awarding contracts for construction.

7. The ENGINEER will review and approve, for conformance with the design concept, any necessary shop and working drawings furnished by contractors.

8. The ENGINEER will interpret the intent of the drawings and specifications to protect the OWNER against defects and deficiencies in construction on the part of the contractors. The ENGINEER will not, however, guarantee the performance by any contractor.

9. The ENGINEER will establish baselines for locating the work together with a suitable number of benchmarks adjacent to the work as shown in the contract documents.

10. The ENGINEER will provide general engineering review of the work of the contractors as construction progresses to ascertain that the contractor is conforming with the design concept.

11. Unless notified by the OWNER in writing that the OWNER will provide for resident inspection, the ENGINEER will provide resident construction inspection. The ENGINEER'S undertaking hereunder shall not relieve the contractor of contractor's obligation to perform the work in conformity with the drawings and specifications and in a workmanlike manner; shall not make the ENGINEER an insurer of the contractor's performance; and shall not impose upon the ENGINEER any obligation to see that the work is performed in a safe manner.

12. The ENGINEER will cooperate and work closely with funding Agency representatives.

13. The ENGINEER will review the contractor's applications for progress and final payment and, when approved, submit same to the OWNER for payment.

14. The ENGINEER will prepare necessary contract change orders for approval of the OWNER, the funding Agency, and others on a timely basis.

15. The ENGINEER will make a final review prior to the issuance of the statement of substantial completion of all construction and submit a written report to the OWNER and the funding Agency. The ENGINEER shall submit a statement of completion to the OWNER and the funding Agency along with the final pay request.

16. The ENGINEER will provide the OWNER with one set of digital record (as-built) drawings, and two sets of prints at no additional cost to the OWNER. Such drawings will be based upon construction records provided by the contractor during construction and reviewed by the resident inspector and from the resident inspector's construction data.

17. If State statutes require notices and advertisements of final payment, the ENGINEER shall assist in their preparation.

18. The ENGINEER will be available to furnish engineering services and consultations necessary to correct unforeseen project operation difficulties for a period of one year after the date of statement of completion of the facility. This service will include instruction of the OWNER in initial project operation and maintenance but will not include supervision of normal operation of the system. Such consultation and advice shall be furnished without additional charge except for travel and subsistence costs. The ENGINEER will assist the OWNER in performing a review of the project during the 11th month after the date of the certificate of substantial completion.

19. The ENGINEER further agrees to obtain and maintain, at the ENGINEER'S expense, such insurance as will protect the ENGINEER from claims under the Workman's Compensation Act and such comprehensive general liability insurance as will protect the OWNER and the ENGINEER from all claims for bodily injury, death, or property damage which may arise from the performance by the ENGINEER or by the ENGINEER'S employees of the ENGINEER'S functions and services required under this Agreement.

SECTION B - COMPENSATION FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES

1. The OWNER shall compensate the ENGINEER for design and contract administration engineering services in the amount of:

Fifty Thousand and No/100	Dollars (\$50,000.00)

2. The ENGINEER will render to OWNER for such services an itemized bill, once each month, for compensation for such services performed hereunder during such period, the same to be due and payable by the OWNER to the ENGINEER on or before the 20th day of the following period.

3. The compensation for engineering services shall not exceed the following milestones:

(a) A sum which equals seventy percent (70%) of the total compensation payable under Section B-1, after completion and submission of the construction drawings, specifications, cost estimates, and contract documents, and the acceptance of the same by OWNER, the Department of Environmental Quality, and the funding Agency.

(b) A sum which, together with the compensation provided in Section B-3-(a) above, equals eighty percent (80%) of the compensation payable immediately after the construction contracts are awarded.

(c) A sum equal to fifteen percent (15 %) of the compensation will be paid on a monthly basis for general engineering review of the contractor's work during the construction period on percentage ratios identical to those approved by the ENGINEER as a basis upon which to make partial payments to the contractor(s). However, payment under this paragraph and of such additional sums as are due the ENGINEER by reason of any necessary adjustments in the payment computations will be in an amount so that the aggregate of all sums paid to the ENGINEER will equal ninety-five (95%) of the compensation. A final payment to equal 100 percent shall be made when it is determined that all services required by this Agreement have been completed except for the services set forth in Section A-18 hereof.

SECTION C - ADDITIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES

In addition to the foregoing being performed, the following services may be provided UPON PRIOR WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION OF THE OWNER and written approval of the funding Agency.

- 1. Laboratory tests, well tests, borings, specialized geological, soils, hydraulic or other studies recommended by the ENGINEER.
- 2. Assistance in negotiating for land and easement rights.
- 3. Necessary data and filing maps for water rights, water adjudication, and litigation.

4. Redesigns ordered by the OWNER after final plans have been accepted by the OWNER and the funding Agency, except redesigns to reduce the project cost to within the funds available.

- 5. Appearances before courts or boards on matters of litigation or hearings related to the project.
- 6. Performance of detailed staking necessary for construction of the project in excess of the control staking set forth in Section A-9.

SECTION D - INSPECTION SERVICES

Roles and Responsibilities of the Resident Inspector:

- 1. Acts as the Owner's on site representative.
- 2. Communicates as necessary with the engineer and contractor's superintendent in a timely and productive manner. Transmits the engineer's interpretations of the plans and specifications to the contractor. Transmits the contractor's suggestions for modifications to the engineer. Immediately alerts both the engineer and contractor when any work appears to be out-of-compliance with contract documents or with normal construction practices.
- 3. Observes work-in-progress and constantly compares it to what is specified and shown on the plans.
- 4. Compares approved submittals to corresponding materials and equipment upon delivery. Notifies Engineer and Contractor if any material or equipment is delivered or installed before approval of all required and related submittals.
- 5. Verifies that required tests of materials and equipment are performed in accordance with contract documents and confirms that results meet the requirements of the contract documents. Provides advance notification to Engineer of scheduled testing. Provides notification to Owner and Engineer of failed testing.
- 6. Marks up a set of plans as construction progresses to assist the Engineer in preparing As Built Drawings. Establishes a mark-up color chart with Engineer at Project initiation for drawing deletions, additions, comments, etc.
- 7. Reviews Contractor's pay estimates and provides comments to Engineer regarding the accuracy and correctness of quantities claimed and materials stored.
- 8. Assists Engineer in preparing a Punch List of observed items requiring correction and verifies correction of punch list items prior to final inspection.
- 9. Limitations of Inspector's Authority
 - (a) Does not authorize deviations from the contract documents.
 - (b) Does not undertake any of the responsibilities of the Contractor, Subcontractors, Engineer or Owner.
 - (c) Does not advise on, or issue directions relative to, any aspect of the means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction unless such is specifically called for in the contract documents.
 - (d) Does not authorize the Owner to occupy the project in whole or in part.
 - (e) Does not participate in specialized field or laboratory tests unless authorized to do so.

SECTION E - COMPENSATION FOR RESIDENT INSPECTION

1. The OWNER shall compensate the ENGINEER for design and contract administration engineering services in the amount of:

Twenty Thousand and No/100Dollars (\$20,000.00

2. The ENGINEER will render to OWNER for such services an itemized bill, once each month, for compensation for such services performed hereunder during such period, the same to be due and payable by the OWNER to the ENGINEER on or before the 20th day of the following period.

SECTION E - INTEREST ON UNPAID SUMS

If OWNER fails to make any payment due ENGINEER within 60 days for services and expenses and funds are available for the project then the ENGINEER shall be entitled to interest at the rate of 12% per annum from said 60th day, not to exceed an annual rate of 12 percent.
