| | The property is located within an unincorporated portion of northeastern Grady County abutting on North County Line Road. |
| | The City maintains and operates a 12-inch water supply line from OKC along this road right-of-way. The developers desires to be served by the City of Blanchard. |
| | A Development Agreement is attached in which the developers have agreed to and signed. This Agreement was reviewed and approved by the City Attorney. |

DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is made and entered into between Shaz Investment Group, LLC, an Oklahoma limited liability company, hereinafter referred to as "Developer", a party of the first part and the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority, an Oklahoma public trust authority, hereinafter referred to as "Authority" and the City of Blanchard, Oklahoma, an Oklahoma municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "City."

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS the Authority is an Oklahoma Public Trust Authority whose sole beneficiary is the City and the City is an Oklahoma Municipal Corporation located in McClain County and Grady County, Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS the Authority owns, operates and maintains a public water system in McClain County and Grady County, Oklahoma, that services water customers in both counties of McClain and Grady, hereinafter referred to as the "Blanchard Water System"; and

WHEREAS the Developer owns certain property described as part of the South Half of Section 12-T9N-R5W of the Indian Meridian, Grady County, Oklahoma, hereinafter referred to be developed as a subdivision named Napa Valley (the "Addition") and desires to utilize the Blanchard Water System to provide a public water supply to future customers that will be located within the Addition; and

WHEREAS the current location of the Authority's main water trunk line nearest to the proposed Addition is 12-inch water main located County Line Avenue North at 16th Street SW; and

WHEREAS neither the Authority nor the City is currently willing to expend resources to construct and extend a main trunk line extension from this area to the proposed Addition; and

WHEREAS the Developer is willing to design and construct, at its own expense, a main water trunk line extension (hereinafter the "Project") from the Authority's existing main water trunk line at the intersection of County Line Avenue North and 16th Street SW to serve the new Addition and dedicate said line to the Authority, to include setting aside land for a new water tower site to the Authority; and

WHEREAS the Developer is also willing to pay the Authority, as set out below, in lieu of a requirement for the Developer to upgrade the existing booster station located at E1180 Road and County Line Avenue North.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits, covenants and agreements contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- Developer agrees to obtain private easements that are adequate for the construction, operation and maintenance of the water main extension and construct an adequate water main line extension and all appurtenances as required by the ODEQ and according to the plans and specifications that have been approved by the Authority to the Addition. The easements and water main extension shall be located, designed and constructed as set forth on plans as approved by the Authority and attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 2. The Developer agrees to bear all costs associated with the design and construction of the water main line extension, including but not limited to obtaining approval from all required county and state agencies. The Developer agrees that it will complete the Project in compliance with all established procedures and regulations of the City and the Authority. Upon satisfactory completion of the Project, the easements shall be assigned to the Authority and the water main and all appurtenances shall be dedicated and accepted to and by the Authority and the Developer shall provide a one (1) year maintenance bond in favor of the Authority.
- 3. Upon acceptance of the Project, the City and the Authority shall clearly note upon its municipal utility maps the existence of the Project.
- 4. The Developer also agrees to pay to the City and the Authority Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) in lieu of an upgrade by Developer to the existing booster station located at E1180 Road and County Line Avenue North.
- 5. The Developer understands and agrees that the sale of each tract within the said Addition will be subject to a covenant (either contained within the deed or in a set of recorded restrictive covenants recorded prior to the sale of any tract within the Addition) requiring that every structure located within the Addition shall be connected to the public water supply and that NO water from any water well or any other source shall be cross-connected to said structures in any manner that could allow the public water supply to be contaminated.
- 6. Each tract shall be required to have its own water meter and all water customers shall be subject to a Contract for Municipal Water Service with the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority and the rules and regulations of the Blanchard Municipal Water System and the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority regarding the delivery and purchase of water.
- Developer acknowledges that no part of the Addition is located within the municipal limits of any city or town or within the geographic limits of any

organized Rural Water District and that no part of the land to be served by the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority is subject to any state or federal statutory provision or any contractual agreements between third parties or the Developer or any predecessor in title to the Developer that would in any way limit or prohibit the ability of the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority to provide water service to customers within the Addition. Developer agrees to indemnify and hold the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority harmless for all losses, suits, judgments, claims, damages, and liability arising from such limitation or prohibition if such limitation or prohibition is later asserted.

- 8. Developer recognizes and acknowledges that the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority water rate structure provides that water rates for water service is double the rate for water service provided inside the municipal limits of the City of Blanchard and that such rates will apply to each meter within the Addition. The Developer will indemnify and hold the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority harmless for all losses, suits, judgments, claims, damages, and liability arising from the existing rate structure for service outside the municipal limits and acknowledges that the customer of each individual meter will be required to execute a water purchase agreement pursuant to state law and that said water purchase agreements will contain language setting forth the fact that water rates outside the city limits will be double the rate for water sold inside the city limits.
- The public water system shall not be extended beyond the Addition without the written consent of the City and the Authority and any such extension shall be constructed according to the rules of the City of Blanchard and the State of Oklahoma.
- 10. The laws of the State of Oklahoma shall govern this Agreement.







This fee allows the Authority to provide transparency in billing by showing the true cost of providing safe water. In addition, a proposed eight (8%) percent on water utility for infrastructure improvements. And a sanitary sewer set fee for sewer infrastructure improvements. |

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-____

A RESOLUTION OF THE BLANCHARD MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENT AUTHORITY (HEREINAFTER "AUTHORITY"), ESTABLISHING NEW RATES, FEES, AND COSTS CHARGED BY THE BLANCHARD MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENT AUTHORITY FOR BLANCHARD SERVICES.

WHEREAS the Authority has reviewed various rates, fees, and costs charged for utility services provided by the Authority; and

WHEREAS the Authority has determined that the infrastructure needs of the Blanchard community, at present and in the future, justify the addition of additional rates, fees, and costs to ensure that the Authority will recover its expenses involved in providing certain services, including providing adequate capacity, maintenance, and pressures; and

WHEREAS the Authority has determined that the mandated testing to ensure that water served to Blanchard water customers meets the regulations of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ) justifies the addition of an additional fee to ensure that the Authority will recover its expenses related to the provision of said testing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority that a new sanitary sewer infrastructure fee, the amount of which shall be established by resolution, is hereby established. The revenue generated by said infrastructure fee is hereby enumerated to be spent on capital improvement projects relating to the provision of sanitary sewer.

BE IT FURTHER resolved that a new EPA/ODEQ regulatory testing fee is hereby established, the amount of which shall be established by resolution.

BE IT FURTHER resolved that eight percent (8%) of revenues generated by water rates, inclusive of all rate types, but not inclusive of the EPA/ODEQ regulatory testing fee or other fees, are hereby enumerated to be spent on capital improvement projects relating to the provision of water.

PASSED and **APPROVED** by the Board of Trustees of the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority on this 26th day of October, 2023, which will become effective on the later of January 1, 2024 or the effective date of rate and/or fee schedules which establish rates for the new rates, fees, and costs established.

| Background: | City staff conducted a comprehensive study of water rates, revenues, and expenses for the Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority over the past several months. Based on the direction of the BMIA trustees and the City Council, a proposal for utility rates has been submitted. The new utility rates include the provision of an infrastructure fee for sanitary sewer, an escalation in rates for water sufficient to erase the deficit in water service, as well as enable the creation of a water infrastructure fund to be funded with 8% of water rate revenues, and a monthly fee of \$0.25 per customer per month for mandated regulatory testing pursuant to US EPA and ODEQ regulations. |
| | The created infrastructure funds for water and sanitary sewer are critical to meeting Blanchard's infrastructure needs over the next several years. |
| Exhibits: | Resolution |
| Financial Impact: | The financial impact of this Resolution will enable the City to recover costs for providing water and sewer service as the rates for providing water and sewer service, as well as the costs of providing maintenance and staffing the water and sewer departments, all continue to rise. This will also enable the City to earmark funds for capital infrastructure needs for necessary projects. |
| | It is the intention of staff to make these changes in a manner that enables the City to meet its financial obligations without creating undue hardship on our community members, and the impacts on our minimum and median-consumption households are as follows: |
| | The proposed water, sanitary sewer, and trash combined bill for minimum consumption rises to \$50.23, an increase of \$8.13 from the previous minimum combined bill of \$42.10. |

Allied Core Construction is requesting that we approach the route of a septic system for the address of 801 S Tyler. We deem that the installation of such will surpass the negative impacts of attaching a sewer line to the nearest line, which would be to the neighbors to the north (Daycare facility).

Upon inspection the Plumber has verified that there were two access points for sewer for 801 S Tyler. One being the NW corner of Roosevelt and S Tyler avenue, and the other on SE 7th just west of S Tyler. The location on Roosevelt is too shallow to be a good option for the property per plumber Staggs Plumbing, and the one on 7th is the location in question. If we were to attach to the most north sewer line off of daycare facility I was advised that we would have to install a lift station to make the system operate correctly on our end. In the event that the system would fail or back up on our end between us and the daycare, the sewage could potentially be pumped into the daycare facility without any kind of notice. Not ideal, and not a risk that seems to not outweigh the upside.

Being that there are no other options for sewer on this location we pray that there can be additional provisions made for this property. Please consider septic and or aerobic to be an option, we currently are in the process of the build and have locked in contracts.



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
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

NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Pursuant to the Oklahoma Environmental Quality Code, 27A O.S. § 2-3-502(A) and the Oklahoma Administrative Code ("OAC"), this is to provide you with a notice of a finding by the State of Oklahoma, ex rel. Department of Environmental Quality – Environmental Complaints and Local Services Division ("DEQ") of alleged non-compliance with statute(s), and/or rule(s).

On August 21, 2023, DEQ personnel went to Blanchard WWT, Facility No. S-20620 ("Facility") and performed a compliance monitoring inspection ("inspection") (DEQ Form # 619-002). The Facility is located in McClain County, Oklahoma, and is owned and operated by Blanchard Public Works Authority. The Facility is a five (5) cell total retention lagoon system with a water reuse system in the Lower Canadian – Walnut Watershed (HUC 11090202).

During the inspection, DEQ personnel observed the following violations:

- failure to operate the collection system in accordance with the permit,
- failure to prevent unpermitted discharges of raw sewage from the West 7th Street pump station,
- failure to maintain all pump station alarms,
- failure to maintain all pumps,
- failure to maintain backup power at West 7th Street pump station,
- failure to prevent bypasses, and
- failure to install and maintain operable fail-safe systems.

On August 21, 2023, DEQ personnel provided a copy of the inspection (DEQ Form # 619-002) to the Facility. The inspection report identified the above-described violations. "Attached hereto as "Exhibit 1".

On August 22, 2023, DEQ received a report of an unpermitted discharge of approximately 125 gallons of raw sewage into Walnut Creek from the manhole near 623 S Madison in Blanchard due to the bypass pump running out of fuel.

On August 25, 2023, DEQ received a report of an unpermitted discharge of approximately 750 gallons of raw sewage into Walnut Creek from the same manhole because the pump quit pumping.

On September 5, 2023, DEQ received a report of an unpermitted discharge of approximately 460 gallons of raw sewage into Walnut Creek from the same manhole due to a clogged suction hose.

On September 6, 2023, DEQ received a report of an unpermitted discharge of approximately 875 gallons of raw sewage into Walnut Creek from the same manhole due to the bypass pump failing.

Your reports indicate that after each bypass the affected area was flushed with water from the hydrant and treated with lime.

As of the date of this Notice of Violation ("NOV"), you have failed to prevent recurrence of the above-referenced violations.

ISSUE

27A O.S. § 2-6-105(A) states:

It shall be unlawful for any person to cause pollution of any waters of the state or to place or cause to be placed any wastes in a location where they are likely to cause pollution of any air, land, or waters of the state. Any such action is hereby declared to be a public nuisance.

OAC 252:619-1-4(d) states:

- (d) **Discharges prohibited.** The permittee shall operate and maintain the total retention lagoon system so that no part of the system bypasses or discharges wastes or wastewater. All such bypasses and/or discharges shall be considered a violation of this Chapter and be subject to enforcement as an unpermitted discharge to waters of the State in violation of the Oklahoma Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Act.
 - (1) **Reporting requirement.** The permittee shall ensure that any and all bypasses and/or discharges from a total retention lagoon system are reported

- to DEQ at (800) 522-0206 within 24-hours of the incident and that a completed and signed DEQ Form 619-001 "Self Reporting Wastewater Bypass Form" is submitted to DEQ within five (5) days of the incident.
- (2) **Required response.** Whenever a bypass or discharge occurs, the permittee shall ensure that immediate action is taken to stop, contain, clean up and prevent recurrence of the bypass or discharge.

OAC 252:627-1-5(c) states:

45

- (c) **Discharges prohibited.** Suppliers shall ensure that all parts of water reuse systems are operated and maintained so that there are no unpermitted bypasses or discharges of wastewater or reclaimed water from the system. All such bypasses and/or discharges shall be considered violations of this Chapter and shall be subject to enforcement as an unpermitted discharge to waters of the state in violation of the Oklahoma Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Act.
 - (1) **Reporting requirement.** Suppliers shall ensure that any and all bypasses and/or discharges from water reuse systems are reported to DEQ at (800) 522-0206 within 24-hours of an incident and that a completed and signed DEQ Form 619-001 "Self Reporting Wastewater Bypass Form" is submitted to DEQ within five (5) days of the incident.
 - (2) **Required response.** Suppliers shall ensure that immediate action is taken to stop, contain, clean up and prevent recurrence of bypasses or discharges.

DEQ alleges that Respondent is in violation of 27A § 2-6-105(A), OAC 252:619-1-4(d), and OAC 252:627-1-5(c) for failing to maintain the collection system to prevent unpermitted discharges. This failure has caused untreated wastewater to be discharged into the environment. Such discharges are also known as "bypasses."

OAC 252:619-3-1(d) states:

- (d) **Pump stations.** The permittee shall ensure that pump stations are properly maintained and operated by doing the following:
 - (1) Securing pump stations to prevent unauthorized access.
 - (2) Maintaining the pumps in working condition.
 - (3) Keeping the screens free of debris to prevent clogging.
 - (4) Maintaining the required alarms in working order.
 - (5) Maintaining the required back-up generators and/or portable engine driven pumps in working order.
 - (6) Maintaining a complete set of operational instructions, emergency procedures and maintenance schedules.

DEQ alleges Respondent is in violation of OAC 252:619-3-1(d) for failing to maintain operable pumps and install and maintain operable fail-safe systems.

It is your duty to correct the violations referenced above, within fifteen (15) days of your receipt of this NOV, by taking whatever immediate corrective action is necessary to prevent

the recurrence of the violations cited herein. Further, within fifteen (15) days of receipt of this NOV, you shall submit to DEQ a written response detailing the specific actions taken, why such actions are sufficient to prevent recurrence of the cited violations, and provide a written explanation why you should not be assessed an administrative penalty for the violations and discharges cited herein.

DEQ will re-inspect the Facility approximately fifteen (15) days after you receive this NOV. Please be advised that failure to comply with this NOV or to submit a response within fifteen (15) days of receipt will result in further enforcement, including, but not limited to, penalties and injunctive relief.
