AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD, OKLAHOMA, AS AMENDED TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL TERRITORY WITHIN THE (R-1), SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT; TO DELETE SUCH PROPERTY FROM THE S-1 SUBURBAN DISTRICT; PROVIDING FOR ENTERING SUCH AMENDMENTS UPON THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; DECLARING REPEALER; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.


WHEREAS, Clint and Evva King filed an application for a zoning reclassification of property as described in Section 1 below from S-1, Suburban District to the R-1, Single-Family Residential District; and

WHEREAS, the Blanchard Planning Commission held a public hearing on said application at their regular meeting on Thursday, J anuary 11th, 2024 to solicit general input in accordance with the Blanchard Code of Ordinances and Title 11 O.S. Section 43-104, where the Commission voted and adopted Resolution No. 2024-02 recommending approval; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. That the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Blanchard, Oklahoma, as amended, is hereby amended to change the boundaries of the R-1, Single-Family Residential District, as shown upon the Official Zoning Map, to include therein the following described property in McClain County, State of Oklahoma, to wit;

Lot Two (2) in Block Three (3), of Summer Field Phase III, being a part of the Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SW/4 SE/4), the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (SE/4 SW/4) and the Southwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SW/4 NW/4 SE/4) of Section Twenty-five (25), Township Eight (8) North, Range Five (5) West of the I. M., Grady County, Oklahoma, according to the recorded corrected plat thereof.

SECTION 2. That the said described property in McClain County, State of Oklahoma, shall not be designated as part of the (S-1), Suburban District upon the Official Zoning Map of the City of Blanchard, and is Hereby Deleted therefrom.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, said portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. REPEALER. All former ordinances and / or parts of the ordinances conflicting or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. Whereas, it being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, peace, and safety of the City of Blanchard and the inhabitants thereof, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval, as provided by law

## ORDINANCE NO. 806

# AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD, OKLAHOMA, TO AMEND §21-736, EXTERIOR WALLS, OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD, OKLAHOMA; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; DECLARING REPEALING; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. 

SECTION 1. That Section 21-736 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Blanchard is hereby amended to read as follows:

## \$21-736 Exterior Walls

1. To provide for attractive, compatible, and aesthetic structures within the commercial districts, the use of exposed metal, untreated concrete blocks, including painted concrete blocks, and unfinished or untreated concrete panels shall be prohibited in any wall(s) facing a street.
A. Architectural Metal Panels shall be allowed as a veneer in the commercial districts as defined by this ordinance, except that architectural metal panels, and all other metal finishes are prohibited in the C-6 General Commercial zoning district.
B. Metal trim and guttering shall be allowed.
2. Definitions. The following definitions of words and terms as they are used in this section. Any terms not contained within this list shall be constructed in this section as defined in the latest edition of Webster's Unabridged Dictionary.

ARCHITECTURAL METAL PANEL Metal panels are used as a veneer for a structure which creates a flush appearance along the surface of the panel. By definition, fasteners for architectural metal panels are concealed from view from the exterior of the building.

BRICK Any vitrified clay masonry unit that measures at least two inches across in depth at any point.

GUTTERING An appurtenance used to divert stormwater from a structure that does not exceed 30 inches in girth at any point.

UNFINISHED Not having a coating of weatherproof paint or other similar finish.

VENEER A durable protective or ornamental facing; specifically, of stone, brick stucco, siding, or architectural metal panels.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, said portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. REPEALER. All former ordinances and/ or parts of ordinances conflicting or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. EMERGENCY. Whereas, it being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Blanchard and the inhabitants thereof, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval, as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 807
AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE 2, SECTIONS 3-202, 3-203 AND 3-204 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD, OKLAHOMA RELATING TO REGISTRATION AND MICROCHIPPING OF DOGS AND CATS; DECLARING REPEALER; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

## NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 3, Article 2, Section 3-202, 3-203 and 3-204 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Blanchard are hereby amended to read as follows:

## §3-202 REGISTRATION AND TAGS FOR DOGS OR CATS.

1. A fee as set by motion or resolution by the City Council per year for every male or female dog or cat more than four (4) months of age is hereby levied upon the owner of any such dog or cat kept or harbored within the city.
2. The fee levied in this section shall not apply to a dog or cat temporarily brought and kept within the city for a period of less than fifteen (15) days, nor to a dog or cat brought within the city to participate in a dog or cat show, nor to a certified service animal, nor to dogs or cats being kept in kennels or pet shops for sale.
3. The owner of the animal shall pay the fee levied to the City of Blanchard or contracted veterinarian for every calendar year within thirty (30) days of vaccination, provided that a dog or cat that is certified to have been vaccinated for a three (3) year period, shall also pay an annual fee each year during the continued effectiveness of the vaccination period.
4. Before the city or contracted veterinarian accepts any money offered in payment of the fee for a dog or cat or issues a license for it, the person offering the fee shall present to the City of Blanchard the certificate of a veterinarian or other person legally authorized to immunize dogs or cats, showing that the dog or cat has been immunized against rabies.

## § 3-203 LICENSE APPLICATIONS FOR DOGS AND CATS.

A. Written application for a dog or cat license and payment of the applicable annual license fee shall be made to the City of Blanchard or contracted veterinarian (list of contracted veterinarians shall be listed on the City of Blanchard/Animal Control Officer website). The application shall include:

1. The name, telephone number and address of the applicant.
2. A description of the animal, including name, breed, color, gender and age and shall disclose whether the animal has been spayed, neutered or un-altered.
3. If microchipped, the microchip registration number shall be provided.
4. A currently valid rabies certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian showing that said animal has been vaccinated.
B. The annual license fee shall be at an amount set by motion or resolution of the City Council.
C. Service Animals which are professionally and specifically trained shall be exempt from the license fee.
D. The license will be effective for a period of one (1) year.
E. Upon acceptance of the license application, the owner of the animal shall have the option of a microchip or a metal tag for identification purposes. If a microchip is selected, it shall be the owner's responsibility to register the chip on a provided website and maintain the accuracy of the details of the registration. Should a metal tag be selected, the City of Blanchard shall issue the owner a metal license tag stamped with an identifying number for the animal. The City of Blanchard shall also issue the owner a license certificate which identifies the animal by age, gender, breed, color, name and owner, and which states the dates of issuance and expiration of the license.

## § 3-204 TAG TO BE PLACED ON COLLAR; LOST TAGS.

A. The owner of the animal shall cause the tag received from the City of Blanchard or contracted veterinarian to be affixed to the collar of the animal upon which the fee has been paid so that the tag can easily be seen by officers of the city. It shall be the responsibility of the owner of the animal that the animal wears the tag at all times.
B. In the event a license tag or license certificate is lost before the end of the year for which it was issued, the owner may obtain a duplicate tag or certificate after paying the applicable fee as set by motion or resolution by the City Council.

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All former ordinances or parts of Ordinance conflicting or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, said portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. EMERGENCY. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Blanchard and the inhabitants thereof, an emergency is hereby declared to exist by reason whereof, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval, as provided by law.

In 1993, the Oklahoma legislature passed the Oklahoma Standards for Workplace Drug and Alcohol Testing Act, 40 O.S. § 551 et seq. to allow employers to perform drug and alcohol testing of its employees under certain circumstances.

Several years ago, the U.S. Department of Transportation expanded the rules for drug and alcohol testing to include all holders of Commercial Drivers Licenses who operate vehicles of more than 26,000 pounds. For additional information, you can refer to the U.S. Code Title 49 CRF.

## Membership in the Local Government Testing Consortium (LGTC), provides:

1. Participation in a Drug \& Alcohol program that meets all Oklahoma \& US DOT program requirements for the testing process and donor privacy.
2. Random test generation and administration.
3. Materials, in person classes and/or digital media for required supervisor training.
4. On-Site collection of specimens for drug testing.
5. On-Site testing for alcohol.
6. Email result reports available as well as reports of any violations.
7. Medical Review Officer review of all positive results and confidential contact with the donor of a positive collection for drug use.
8. All-inclusive billing - billed annually or semi-annually.
9. After hours emergency response, if necessary.

Consortium Member Agreement
This agreement is entered into this $\qquad$ day of $\qquad$ , 20 $\qquad$ , between the Local Government Testing Consortium (LGTC) and (MEMBER).

LGTC and the MEMBER agree as follows:
LGTC and MEMBER will comply with the Oklahoma Standards for Workplace Drug and Alcohol Testing, 40 O.S. § 551 et seq.

To comply with the requirements for alcohol and controlled substances testing programs for commercial drivers as set out at 49 CFR Part 382 (the Regulations), the MEMBER will establish a "Substance Abuse Prevention Program" (SAPP) and comply with the requirements of this agreement.

Definitions:
Classification - The proper designation of all covered employees (i.e. DOT, Non-DOT and Safety Sensitive) as set forth in the state law under the Oklahoma Standards for Workplace Drug and Alcohol Testing Act 40 O.S. $\S 554$ et seq and the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana and Patient Protection Act 63 O.S. §427.8 et seq.

Covered Employees - employees who work for the MEMBER and are covered by the MEMBER's Substance Abuse Prevention Program (SAPP).

Designated Employer Representative (DER) - Appointed by the MEMBER, this individual is responsible for ensuring compliance with 49 CFR Part 382 and/or 40 O.S. §551 et seq in the administration of the MEMBER's Substance Abuse Prevention Program (SAPP). The DER is the only person with whom LGTC will discuss or release confidential information.

LGTC Testing Specialist - Individual employed or contracted by LGTC to perform substance testing and/or collections in accordance with 49 CFR Part 382 and/or 40 O.S. $\S 551$ et seq. A Testing Specialist may be a duly assigned employee, or contractor, of a medical clinic, hospital or doctor's office through its agreement with LGTC.

Substance Abuse Prevention Program (SAPP) - a program established by the MEMBER that complies with all aspects of 49 CFR Part 382 and/or 40 O.S. §551 et seq. The SAPP documentation will identify LGTC as the SAPP's testing resource.

Supervisor - a MEMBER employee who has supervisory responsibilities of individuals whom the MEMBER has designated as participants in the MEMBER's SAPP.

Program Year - recognized as the Calendar Year, January through December.

## LGTC RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. LGTC will perform all duties necessary in the operation of the consortium, including arranging for services of a Department of Health \& Human Services (DHHS)-certified drug testing laboratory and a certified Medical Review Officer (MRO).
2. LGTC will provide regular training opportunities for DER's and SUPERVISORS and ensure SAPP training videos are available and updated as needed.
3. Provide organizational binders to assist in the record keeping of the DER for MEMBERS that are subject to Annual Corporation Commission Audits.
4. In the event a specialty test is requested by the DER that requires an LGTC collection, round trip mileage will be charged at the current IRS rate, in addition to the stated specialty test fee.
5. LGTC will make a reasonable attempt to arrange for local specimen collection site, when unable to complete on-site testing.

## MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES:

6. MEMBER will appoint a Designated Employer Representative (DER). The DER is responsible for ensuring the MEMBER's Substance Abuse Prevention Program complies with 49 CFR Part 382 and/or 40 O.S. $\$ 551$ et seq.
7. MEMBER will appoint an alternate DER to coordinate random testing in the event the DER is unavailable.
8. DER RESPONSIBILITIES:
a. Annually, complete DER training provided by LGTC. Training covers DER responsibilities to include who could be covered by the SAPP, records retention and reporting requirements.
b. Watch LGTC training videos once in a twelve (12) month period.
c. Register with the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) if the MEMBER has employees that must meet DOT standards (ex: CDL requirements). Registration provides the DER with notification of DOT updates and regulations. It is the DER's responsibility to ensure the MEMBER's SAPP is in compliance with all applicable regulations.
d. Properly classify covered employees as DOT, Non-DOT or Safety Sensitive. Please refer to "Classification" under the Definitions section of this document for additional information.
e. For purposes of random testing, the MEMBER shall ensure that the random pool list provided to LGTC by the MEMBER meets the definition of safety sensitive as defined in 40 O.S. $\S 554$ and 63 O.S. $\S 427.8$. LGTC has no way to verify whether each employee qualifies as safety sensitive and will not be held liable for testing employees who do not meet the definition of safety sensitive.
f. Provide LGTC with a list of employees enrolled in the MEMBER's SAPP upon request for random testing purposes. Employee information should include name, driver's license number and classification. The information should be provided in an Excel spreadsheet.
g. Establish a testing location that meets the needs of the testing to occur (urine sampling and/or breath analysis).
h. Maintain all records of drug and alcohol testing and results. Such records must be available for review by appropriate regulatory bodies upon request. Further such records must be secured as confidential personnel records.
9. SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITIES:
a. Annually, attend Recognizing Substance Abuse in the Workplace training.
10. The Program is offered by LGTC as a service to its members, but responsibility for compliance with State and Federal law and regulations remains with the MEMBER.

## FEES:

11. MEMBER will pay to LGTC the fees set out in the attached consortium fee schedule. Fees may be reviewed and revised by LGTC and can be set up on a one pay or two payments per year plan for the Consortium fee, and specialty bills and mileage will be invoiced after service is provided.

## AGREEMENT PERIOD:

12. This Agreement shall remain in force and in effect until terminated by one of the parties or until such time as federal regulations under which this agreement is executed are no longer applicable.

## CANCELLATION OF MEMBERSHIP:

13. LGTC or the MEMBER may terminate this agreement with a ninety (90) day written notice, due to, but not limited to, failure to pay the required fees or failure to comply with the provisions of the Program or the Regulations.
14. Failure to comply with the requirements of this agreement will result in the MEMBER's removal from the testing pool and program.

## Consortium Fee Schedule

BACKGROUND:
The Blanchard Police Department requested funding for the replacement of two vehicles. The City Council approved the FYE2024 Budget appropriating $\$ 88,000$ for the purchase of two vehicles. One vehicle has already been purchased and added to the fleet. The department is ready to purchase the other budgeted vehicle.

The vehicle is a 2023 Ford Explorer PPV and is available for \$45,447.00 (see window sticker attachment) under Oklahoma State Contract SW035 thru Ford Fleet and Government Sales, OKC, OK (Bob Moore Ford LLC). I discovered this 2023 Ford Interceptor through our Blanchard Fire Department after they purchased a truck through Ford Fleet. Also, I have done extensive research for other SUV's in Oklahoma and Texas. The only other way we can purchase a vehicle within this price point and get it immediately is to purchase a used vehicle at near the same price point from Texas. These Police SUV's in Texas would be a 2020 or 2021 with 40-60 thousand miles. Therefore, the purchase of this brand new 2023 Ford Interceptor would be cost effective. The vehicle we would be replacing is the 2015 Ford Interceptor SUV that has been taken out of service due to hail damage and costly repairs needed.

Therefore, it is requested that the City Manager be authorized to use approved funding for vehicles from the FYE2024 Budget to make this purchase. The Police Department has $\$ 45,082.40$ dollars left in our Fleet vehicle budget for FYE2023. Attached is the Bob Moore Ford, LLC
awarded state contract and vehicle information. The difference with the reminding budget will be moved from another line item, if necessary.

If this 2023 Ford Explorer Interceptor SUV is agreed upon for purchase, the Blanchard Police Department would be able to obtain possession immediately due to the vehicle being "on the ground" at Bob Moore Ford Fleet located at S.E. 89th and I-35 Service Road in OKC, OK. Purchasing this vehicle "out right" would allow the Blanchard Police Department to obtain possession immediately. As of now, the Deputy Chief is having to drive a vehicle needed for our patrol officers.

Funding options:

1. Paying for it outright and supplementing the budget with the sale of surplus vehicles; and/or
2. Lease/Purchase

## ORDINANCE NO. 808


#### Abstract

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD, OKLAHOMA AMENDING CHAPTER 18, ARTICLE 3, SECTION 18-307 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD, OKLAHOMA, RELATING TO THE OPERATION OF NON-CONVENTIONAL MOTORIZED VEHICLES UPON STREETS, PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY AND HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL LIMITS OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.


## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. That the existing Article 3, Section 18-307 of Chapter 18 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Blanchard shall be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

## §18-307 OPERATION OF NON-CONVENTIONAL MOTORIZED VEHICLES UPON STREETS, PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY AND HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL LIMITS OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD

## A. LOW SPEED VEHICLES AND/OR NEIGHBORHOOD ELECTRIC VEHICLES <br> Low Speed Vehicles (LSV)/Neighborhood Electric Vehicles (NEV): An LSV/NEV is a motor vehicle that may look like a golf cart to the casual observer, but is actually a motor vehicle requiring registration and insurance, and operation by a licensed driver. LSV/NEVs may be powered by electric battery or gasoline. Vehicle standards are specified by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration’s (NHTSA) Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) No. 500. (49 Code of Federal Regulations §571.500). An LSV/NEV has 4 wheels, a top attainable speed in 1 mile of more than 20 mph and not more than 25 mph on a paved level surface, a gross vehicle weight rating of less than 3,000 pounds, and a Vehicle Identification Number (VIN). Only LSV/NEVs registered and licensed under Oklahoma law, or registered and licensed in another state shall qualify as an LSV/NEV. Golf carts or modified ("street legal") golf carts do not qualify as LSV/NEVs.

i. The operation of an LSV/NEV is prohibited on any street or highway within the City of Blanchard with a posted speed limit exceeding 25 mph .
ii. The operation of an LSV/NEV is prohibited within the City of Blanchard unless it is registered and licensed as a motor vehicle under Oklahoma state law or legally registered and licensed in another state and must comply with the Compulsory Liability Insurance Law.
iii. The operation of an LSV/NEV is prohibited within the City of Blanchard unless it has a 17-digit Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) assigned by the manufacturer of said LSV/NEV and displays appropriate license plates.
iv. Only drivers having a valid driver’s license may operate LSV/NEVs on streets, highways and public rights of way within the City of Blanchard.
v. LSV/NEVs may not be operated on any bicycle path, walking path or other pedestrian way within the City of Blanchard.
vi. LSV/NEVs shall be subject to the all federal, state and local motor vehicle parking restrictions.
vii. Off-road tires may not be used on LSV/NEVs.

## B. MEDIUM-SPEED ELECTRIC VEHICLES

Medium-Speed Electric Vehicle as defined in 47 O.S. Section 1102, means any selfpropelled, electrically powered four-wheeled motor vehicle, equipped with a roll cage or crush-proof body design, whose speed attainable in one (1) mile is more than thirty (30) miles per hour but not greater than thirty-five (35) miles per hour. Medium-speed electric vehicles shall be registered pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act according to rules for the titling and registration of medium-speed electric vehicles promulgated by Service Oklahoma.
i. The operation of a medium-speed electric vehicles which have been titled and registered pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act may be operated on any highway or street within the City of Blanchard with a posted speed limit of forty-five (45) miles per hour or less; provided, however, medium-speed electrical vehicles shall not be permitted to travel upon any street or highway within the City of Blanchard which is a part of the National System of Interstate and Defense Highways and which otherwise meets or exceeds the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration regulations set forth in 49 C.F.R. 571.500. Operators of medium-speed electrical vehicles shall comply with all traffic regulations and rules of conduct for the operation of motor vehicles on the roadways of this state provided by law including but not limited to the Compulsory Liability Insurance Law.
ii. Only drivers having a valid driver's license may operate Medium-Speed electrical vehicles on streets, highways and public rights of way within the City of Blanchard.
iii. Medium-Speed electrical vehicles may not be operated on any bicycle path, walking path or other pedestrian way within the City of Blanchard.
iv. Medium-speed electrical vehicles shall be subject to the all federal, state and local motor vehicle parking restrictions.
v. Off-road tires may not be used on Medium-speed electrical vehicles.

## C. MINI-TRUCKS

Mini-trucks, as defined by Oklahoma state law and addressed in 47 O.S. Section 1151.3, shall be registered pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act according to rules for titling and registration of mini-trucks promulgated by Service Oklahoma.

Mini-trucks which have been titled and registered pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act may be operated on streets and highways in the City of Blanchard; provided, however, mini-trucks shall not be permitted to travel upon any highway in this state which is a part of the National System of Interstate and Defense Highways. Operators of mini-trucks shall comply with all traffic regulations and rules of conduct for the operation of motor vehicles on the roadways of this state provided by law.

## D. STREET LEGAL UTILITY VEHICLES

Street-legal utility vehicles that are registered as a motor vehicle pursuant to subsection B of Section 1 of this act may be operated on the streets and highways of this state. Provided, however, street-legal utility vehicles shall not be operated on the National System of Interstate and Defense Highways or U.S. highways.

## E. GOLF CARTS AND NON-REGISTERED UTILITY VEHICLES

Golf carts and non-registered utility vehicles, as defined by 47 O.S. Section 1102, shall not be operated on the streets and public rights of way of the City of Blanchard unless, prior to said operation, the owner or the owner's authorized agent shall obtain from the City of Blanchard a written annual permit which shall be issued upon verification of the following:
i. Payment of an annual fee as set by motion or resolution of the City Council (Editor's Note, the initial fee established by the City Council is $\$ 25.00$ ).
ii. Proof of compliance with Compulsory Liability Insurance liability insurance that covers the Golf Cart or non-registered Utility Vehicle.
iii. Provided that the operation of a Golf Cart or non-registered Utility Vehicle on public streets or public rights of way is prohibited on any street or public right of way having a posted speed limit greater than 25 miles per hour
iv. Provided that the operation of a Golf Cart or non-registered Utility Vehicle on public streets or public rights of way is prohibited by any person other than a person who possesses a valid driver's license.
v. Provided that the operation of a Golf Cart or non-registered Utility Vehicle on public streets or public rights of way is prohibited except during daylight hours.
vi. Golf carts or non-registered utility vehicles may operate (crossings only) on state highways within the City of Blanchard, including that portion of State Highway 76 laying between the intersection of North $10^{\text {th }}$ and Main Street and the intersection of North $10^{\text {th }}$ and Council Road, only if making a direct perpendicular
crossing of said state highway at an angle of approximately ninety (90) degrees to the direction of the highway after coming to a complete stop, yielding the right-of-way to all oncoming traffic that constitutes an immediate hazard. The legal authority to cross a state highway shall not apply to divided highways or highways with a posted speed limit of more than thirty-five (35) miles per hour in the area of the crossing.

## F. ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES (ATV's)

All-Terrain Vehicles shall not be operated on the streets and public rights of way of the City of Blanchard unless, prior to said operation, the owner or the owner's authorized agent shall obtain from the City of Blanchard a written annual permit which shall be issued upon verification of the following:
i. Payment of an annual fee as set by motion or resolution of the City Council (Editor's Note, the initial fee established by the City Council is $\$ 25.00$ ).
ii. Proof of compliance with Compulsory Liability Insurance liability insurance that covers the All-Terrain Vehicle.
iii. Provided that the operation of an ATV on public streets or public rights of way is prohibited on any street or public right of way having a posted speed limit greater than 25 miles per hour.
iv. Provided that the operation of an ATV on public streets or public rights of way is prohibited by any person other than a person who possesses a valid driver's license.
v. Provided that the operation of an ATV on public streets or public rights of way is prohibited except during daylight hours.
vi. ATV's may operate (crossings only) on state highways within the City of Blanchard, including that portion of State Highway 76 laying between the intersection of North $10^{\text {th }}$ and Main Street and the intersection of North $10^{\text {th }}$ and Council Road, only if making a direct perpendicular crossing of said state highway at an angle of approximately ninety (90) degrees to the direction of the highway after coming to a complete stop, yielding the right-of-way to all oncoming traffic that constitutes an immediate hazard. The legal authority to cross a state highway shall not apply to divided highways or highways with a posted speed limit of more than thirty-five (35) miles per hour in the area of the crossing.
vii. Required Equipment for All-Terrain Vehicles include standard mufflers, provided that no person shall use a muffler cutout, by-pass, straight pipe or similar devise on an ATV and the apparatus shall not be audible for a distance more than two hundred (200) feet from the operation of the ATV.
viii. Required Equipment for All-Terrain Vehicles include Brakes which shall adequately control movement and stop the ATV under any condition of operation and at least one (1) red tail lamp having a minimum candlepower of sufficient intensity to exhibit a red light plainly visible from a distance of five-hundred (500) feet to the rear.
ix. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate an ATV upon any public sidewalk providing for pedestrian traffic or upon private property of another
without written permission of the owner or person in control of said property or upon on any school grounds without written, signed, and dated permission of responsible school authorities or at a rate of speed greater than twenty-five (25) miles per hour.
x. The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to an all-terrain vehicle used by the governmental agencies in the pursuit of their duties or during emergency use.
xi. Nothing in this ordinance shall prohibit the use of all-terrain vehicles within the right of way of a state or county highway or upon other public streets in the city of Blanchard while participating in a parade permitted by the City of Blanchard.

## G. GOLF CARTS OPERATED BY PERSONS WITH A PHYSICAL DISABILITY

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person with a physical disability as defined by Section 15-112 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall be authorized to operate a golf cart on streets and highways and public rights of way within the City of Blanchard to the extent that the physically disabled person is capable as determined by a physician as defined by Section 15-112 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes if:
i. Operation occurs during daylight hours only;
ii. The golf cart is not operated on roadways with posted speed limits greater than twenty-five (25) miles per hour;
iii. The operator of such golf cart possesses a valid driver license; and
iv. The operator of such golf cart shall provide certified proof of his or her disability.

## H. MINIBIKES, GO-CARTS, MOPEDS AND OTHER MOTOR VEHICLES MANUFACTURED PRINCIPALLY FOR OFF STREET AND OFF HIGHWAY USE

Vehicles known and commonly referred to as Minibikes and other similar trade names are prohibited from operating on streets, highways or public rights of way within the City of Blanchard, except:
i. When used in a parade permitted by the City of Blanchard; or
ii. When registered, as required by 47 O.S. Section 1151(E), by a food vendor and licensed by the City of Blanchard for such purposes upon Blanchard streets having a speed limit of thirty (30) miles per hour or less.

Vehicles known and commonly referred to as Go-Carts are prohibited from operating on streets, highways or public rights of way within the City of Blanchard, except when used in a parade permitted by the City of Blanchard.

Vehicles known as Mopeds, as defined by 47 O.S. Section 1-133.2, are prohibited from being operated on streets, highways and public rights of way within the City of Blanchard, except when used in a parade permitted by the City of Blanchard.

No other motor vehicle not provided for in this Section of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Blanchard may be operated on streets and highways and public rights of way within the City of Blanchard.

## I. PENALTY.

Any person convicted of violating any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to a $\$ 200.00$ fine and impoundment of the motor vehicle involved in said violation. [Ord. No. 2009-05, 4/28/09; Ord. No. 707, 8/27/19; Ord. No. 808, 2/13/24]

## SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.

In the event any word or sentence in this ordinance, or provision or portion of this ordinance, or rules adopted by this ordinance is invalidated by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining words and/or sentences, provisions, or portions thereof shall not be affected and shall continue in full force and effect.

## SECTION 3. EMERGENCY.

It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, peace, and safety of the City of Blanchard and the inhabitants thereof, an emergency is hereby declared to exist by reason whereof, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval, as provided by law.

PASSED and APPROVED and the Emergency Clause voted upon separately and PASSED and APPROVED on this $13^{\text {th }}$ day of February, 2024.

# AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD, OKLAHOMA AMENDING SECTION 18-307 IN ARTICLE 3 OF CHAPTER 18 OF THE BLANCHARD MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING TO ALLTERRAIN VEHICLES; DECLARING REPEALER; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY. 

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLANCHARD, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 18, Article 3, Section 18-307 "MUNICIPALLY OWNED ALLTERRAIN VEHICLES AND MUNICIPALLY OWNED GOLF CARTS" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Blanchard, Oklahoma, is hereby amended to read as follows:

## § 18-307 ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES AND GOLF CARTS.

A. Any person intending to operate an all-terrain vehicle or golf cart on any public roadway within the limits of the City of Blanchard shall obtain an operation permit from the City of Blanchard. The City of Blanchard shall issue a permit upon verification of the following items:

1. Annual fee as set be motion or resolution by the City Council. Editor's note the initial fee is $\$ 25.00$.
2. Driver possesses a valid driver's license.
3. Proof of liability insurance that covers the all-terrain vehicle or golf cart.
B. Required Equipment for All-Terrain Vehicles Following Permit Issuance:
4. Standard mufflers shall be installed and attached to the ATV which reduce the noise of operation of the motor to the minimum necessary for operation. No person shall use a muffler cutout, by-pass, straight pipe, or similar device on the all-terrain vehicle. The apparatus shall not be audible for a distance more than two-hundred (200) feet from the place or places where such devices or apparatus will be located.
5. Brakes shall be installed adequately to control movement of and stop the all-terrain vehicle under any condition of operation.
6. At least one (1) clear headlamp shall be attached to the front, with sufficient intensity to reveal persons and vehicles at a distance of at least one-hundred (100) feet ahead during the hours of darkness and under normal atmospheric conditions, when the all-terrain vehicle is operated between the hours of one-half hour after sunset to 10 pm , or at times of reduced visibility. Such headlamp shall be aimed so that glaring rays are not projected into the eyes of oncoming traffic. The all-terrain vehicle shall also be equipped with a least one (1) red tail lamp having a minimum candlepower of
sufficient intensity to exhibit a red light plainly visible from a distance of five-hundred (500) feet to the rear during hours of darkness under normal atmospheric conditions.
C. Restrictions on Operation of All-Terrain Vehicles Upon Public Roadways:

Once a permit has been issued to any person, it shall be unlawful for that person to drive any all-terrain vehicle or golf cart on the portion of any right of way of any public street, road, trail or alley used for motor vehicle travel, except a person may operate upon the most right-hand lane of a public street or alley unless herein or hereafter restricted, and may, in passing or making a left turn, operate on other lanes which are used for vehicle traffic in the same direction. Operation may be permitted upon the ditch bottom or outside bank of county or state highways which are so configured within the corporate limits. No travel is permitted on any state highway system within corporate limits unless making a perpendicular crossing of a state highway.
D. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate an all-terrain vehicle:

1. Upon any public sidewalk providing for pedestrian traffic.
2. Upon private property of another without written permission of the owner of person in control of said property.
3. Upon on any school grounds without written, signed, and dated permission of responsible school authorities.
4. Upon on any other public place or ground except as may be specifically permitted by other provisions of the ordinance.
5. At any place while under the influence of alcohol or drugs as defined by Oklahoma State Statute 47 OS 11902 , which is hereby incorporated herein by reference.
6. At a rate of speed greater than twenty-five (25) miles per hour.
7. At any place in a careless, reckless, or negligent manner or heedlessly in disregard of the rights or safety of others, or in a manner so as to endanger or be likely to endanger or cause injury or damages to any person or property.
8. During the hours of 10:00pm to 7:00am, except that during said prohibited hours of operation, such operation shall be permitted when returning to the City of Blanchard for the purpose of following the most direct practical route from a point outside the city limits of the City of Blanchard to the residence of the operator or passenger, and except during prohibited hours of operation shall be permitted for the purpose of leaving the City of Blanchard by the most direct practical route to go to a specific destination outside of the City of Blanchard.
9. Without a headlight and taillight at night as consistent with this Chapter.
10. In any trees, nursery, or planting that damages or destroys growing stock or on any private property without the permission of the owner thereof.
11. Entering any intersection without yielding the right of way to any vehicles or pedestrians, which are at the intersection, or close to the intersection as to constitute an immediate hazard.
12. Leaving an all-terrain vehicle in a public place without locking the ignition, removing the key and taking the same with their person.
13. Intentionally driving, chasing, running over, or killing any animal with an all-terrain vehicle.
14. Operating or riding under the age of eighteen (18) without a safety helmet.

## E. Exceptions.

The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to an all-terrain vehicle used by the governmental agencies in the pursuit of their duties or during emergency use. Nothing in this ordinance shall prohibit the use of all-terrain vehicles within the right of way of a state or county highway or upon public lands under the jurisdiction of the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation in an organized contest or even subject to the consent of the official or board having jurisdiction over the highway or public lands. Nothing in this ordinance shall prohibit the use of all-terrain vehicles within the right of way of a state or county highway or upon other public streets in the City of Blanchard during a parade.
F. All other traffic regulations applicable.

When at any time an all-terrain vehicle is operated within the right of way of a public roadway, but outside of the traveled portion, or when an all-terrain vehicle is operated as permitted in crossing a public roadway, all other traffic regulations of the City of Blanchard, including, but not limited to, those permitting to operating or being in actual physical control of a motor vehicle while intoxicated shall be applicable to the operators of such. Furthermore, for the purpose of enforcing traffic regulations at any time that an all-terrain vehicle is within the right of way of a public roadway or lawfully upon the traveled portion of a public roadway, the all-terrain vehicle shall be deemed to be a motor vehicle, as subject to all rules, ordinances, statutes, and regulations pertaining as the same term as defined by Oklahoma State Statutes 47-1134.

## G. Operation of All-Terrain Vehicles by minors.

All-terrain vehicle operators who are minors and wish to operate all-terrain vehicles within the City of Blanchard are subject to the following conditions in addition to those required for adult operators:

1. No minor under sixteen (16) years of age shall be permitted to operate an all-terrain vehicle in the City of Blanchard.
2. All minors at least sixteen (16) years of age but less than eighteen (18) years of age may operate an all-terrain vehicle subject to the restrictions in this chapter if the minor possesses a valid driver's license and wears a safety helmet approved by the Department of Public Safety.
H. Penalty.

Any person convicted of violating any provision of this ordinance is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to a $\$ 200.00$ fine and/or arrest.

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All former ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. In the event any word or sentence in this ordinance, or provision or portion of this ordinance, or rules adopted by this ordinance is invalidated by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining words and/or sentences, provisions, or portions thereof shall not be affected and shall continue in full force and effect.

## LOW SPEED VEHICLES AND/OR NEIGHBORHOOD ELECTRIC VEHICLES

Low Speed Vehicles (LSV)/Neighborhood Electric Vehicles (NEV): An LSV/NEV is a motor vehicle that may look like a golf cart to the casual observer, but is actually a motor vehicle requiring registration and insurance, and operation by a licensed driver. LSV/NEVs may be powered by electric battery or gasoline. Vehicle standards are specified by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration’s (NHTSA) Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) No. 500. (49 Code of Federal Regulations §571.500). An LSV/NEV has 4 wheels, a top attainable speed in 1 mile of more than 20 mph and not more than 25 mph on a paved level surface, a gross vehicle weight rating of less than 3,000 pounds, and a Vehicle Identification Number (VIN). Only LSV/NEVs registered and licensed under Oklahoma law, or registered and licensed in another state shall qualify as an LSV/NEV. Golf carts or modified ("street legal") golf carts do not qualify as LSV/NEVs.

- LSV/NEVs shall not be operated on any street or highway within the City of Blanchard where the posted speed limit exceeds 25 mph .
- Each LSV/NEV must be registered and insured and licensed under Oklahoma law, or legally registered and licensed in another state.
- Each LSV/NEV shall have a 17-digit Vehicle Identification Number (VIN), and display appropriate license plates
- Only drivers having a valid driver's license may operate LSV/NEVs on streets, highways and public rights of way within the City of Blanchard.
- LSV/NEVs may not be operated on any bicycle path, walking path or other pedestrian way within the City of Blanchard.
- LSV/NEVs shall be subject to the all federal, state and local motor vehicle parking restrictions
- Off-road tires may not be used on LSV/NEVs.


## MEDIUM-SPEED ELECTRIC VEHICLES

A. Medium-speed electrical vehicles shall be registered pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act according to rules for the titling and registration of medium-speed electric vehicles promulgated by Service Oklahoma.
B. Medium-speed electrical vehicles which have been titled and registered pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act may be operated on any highway or street within the City of Blanchard with a posted speed limit of forty-five (45) miles per hour or less; provided, however, medium-speed electrical vehicles shall not be permitted to travel upon any street or highway within the City of Blanchard which is a part of the National System of Interstate and Defense Highways and which otherwise meets or exceeds the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration regulations set forth in 49 C.F.R. 571.500. Operators of medium-speed electrical vehicles shall comply with all traffic regulations and rules of conduct for the operation of motor vehicles on the roadways of this state provided by law.

- Only drivers having a valid driver’s license may operate Medium-Speed electrical vehicles on streets, highways and public rights of way within the City of Blanchard.
- Medium-Speed electrical vehicles may not be operated on any bicycle path, walking path or other pedestrian way within the City of Blanchard.
- Medium-speed electrical vehicles shall be subject to the all federal, state and local motor vehicle parking restrictions.
- Off-road tires may not be used on Medium-speed electrical vehicles.


## MINI-TRUCKS

A. Mini-trucks, as defined by Oklahoma state law, shall be registered pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act according to rules for titling and registration of mini-trucks promulgated by Service Oklahoma.
B. Mini-trucks which have been titled and registered pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act may be operated on streets and highways in the City of Blanchard; provided, however, mini-trucks shall not be permitted to travel upon any highway in this state which is a part of the National System of Interstate and Defense Highways. Operators of mini-trucks shall comply with all traffic regulations and rules of conduct for the operation of motor vehicles on the roadways of this state provided by law.

## GOLF CARTS AND UTILITY VEHICLES

Golf carts and utility vehicles, as defined by 47 O.S. Section 1102, shall not be operated on the streets and highways of this state, except:
2. The municipal governing body has adopted an ordinance governing the operation of golf carts and/or utility vehicles on city streets; provided, such ordinances shall include necessary vehicle lighting and safety requirements;
3. Golf carts or utility vehicles may operate on state highways only if making a perpendicular crossing of a state highway located within the boundaries of a municipality which has adopted an ordinance governing the operation of golf carts and/or utility vehicles.

## GOLF CARTS OPERATED BY PERSONS WITH A PHYSICAL DISABILITY

A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any person with a physical disability as defined by Section 15-112 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall be authorized to operate a golf cart on streets and highways and public rights of way within the City of Blanchard to the extent that the physically disabled person is capable as determined by a physician as defined by Section 15112 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes if:

1. Operation occurs during daylight hours only;
2. The golf cart is not operated on roadways with posted speed limits greater than twenty-five (25) miles per hour;
3. The operator of such golf cart possesses a valid driver license; and
4. The operator of such golf cart shall provide certified proof of his or her disability.

## MINIBIKES

Vehicles known and commonly referred to as Minibikes and other similar trade names are prohibited from operating on streets, highways or public rights of way within the City of Blanchard, except:

1. When used in a parade; or
2. When registered, as required by 47 O.S. Section 1151(E), by a food vendor and licensed by the City of Blanchard for such purposes upon Blanchard streets having a speed limit of thirty (30) miles per hour or less.

## GO-CARTS

Vehicles known and commonly referred to as Go-Carts are prohibited from operating on streets, highways or public rights of way within the City of Blanchard.

## STREET LEGAL UTILITY VEHICLES

5. Street-legal utility vehicles that are registered as a motor vehicle pursuant to subsection B of Section 1 of this act may be operated on the streets and highways of this state. Provided, however, street-legal utility vehicles shall not be operated on the National System of Interstate and Defense Highways or U.S. highways.

## MOPEDS

Mopeds, as defined by 47 O.S. Section 1-133.2, are prohibited from being operated on streets, highways and public rights of way within the City of Blanchard.

## ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES

All-terrain vehicles (ATV's) shall not be operated on the streets, highways and public rights of way within the City of Blanchard, except during daylight hours only, if the driver of the ATV is a licensed driver and:
a. the ATV needs to make a direct crossing of the highway while the ATV is legally traveling upon a regularly traveled trail and needs to continue travel from one area of the trail to another and, if the ATV comes to a complete stop, yields the right-of-way to all oncoming traffic that constitutes an immediate hazard, and crosses the highway
at an angle of approximately ninety (90) degrees to the direction of the street or highway. This exception shall not apply to divided highways or streets or highways with a posted speed limit of more than thirty-five (35) miles per hour in the area of the crossing, or
b. the ATV needs to travel on a highway in order to cross a railroad track. In that event, the all-terrain vehicle may travel for not more than three hundred (300) feet on a highway to cross a railroad track.

## OTHER MOTOR VEHICLES WHICH ARE MANUFACTURED PRINCIPALLY FOR USE OFF THE STREETS AND HIGHWAYS

Provided that no other motor vehicle which is manufactured principally for use off the streets and highways may be operated on streets and highways and public rights of way within the City of Blanchard.
