Curbside Bulky Waste

Waste Connections has temporarily suspended the Residential Bulk & Brush services, with limited Residential Trash services to collection of only contents within carts. Bags and bundles that are placed outside of carts will be excluded from collection during this time, in order to minimize the risk of exposure through manual collection or "pickup by hand". The change to go "cart only" on Residential Routes will be in effect through June 1, 2020.

Waste Connections understand that limiting collection services to cart contents only warrants some discretion among residents for what they dispose of and when. Household trash, bags from kitchens and restrooms, should remain a top priority for those waste streams that go into the carts. That's to say, if there is only enough room in the cart remaining for one bag from the kitchen or one bag of yard trimmings, residents are urged to use the space for the bag from the kitchen for health and sanitation purposes.

Now is also a good time to educate customers to bag and tie their household trash, a commonly overlooked best practice. Household trash that is not properly bagged and tied is susceptible spills and further to increases the risk of exposure for Waste Connections personnel to potentially infectious waste.

They appreciate your understanding as they take precautions to protect the health and well-being of their employees, their customers, and their communities. Please trust that they their essential recognize role in maintaining health and sanitation in our communities. Supporting our municipal partners remains one of their highest priorities, right after the safety of their people, and they hope that is evident in their phased approach to plans for continuity of their operations.

House Numbering

In an emergency, first responders (fire, police and ambulance) and utility service technicians depend on clearly marked addresses to find the right home as quickly as possible. Finding a residence can be challenging if street addresses (house numbers) are

unreadable, hidden, unlit or missing. You can help emergency responders and service technicians locate your home by following these tips:

Replace aging or faded numbers;

^o Clear all obstructions (hanging plants, bushes, flags, etc.) from blocking your house number;

• Post large numbers to allow visibility from the street:

^o Place your numbers near the street or on the curb, with a reflective coating and contrasting background;

^o Allow numbers to be seen from all directions (if your home is on ٥ corner, have numbers posted on all sides).

BMC §4-402 requires all building and houses to be numbered. The even numbers (2,4,6, etc.) shall be on the east side of the streets extending north and south, and on the south side of the streets extending east and west; the odd numbers (1,3,5, etc.) shall be on the opposite side of streets.

Memorial Day

The custom of honoring our ancestors by cleaning cemeteries and decorating graves is an ancient and worldwide tradition, but the specific origin of Memorial Day, or Decoration Day as it was first known, are unclear.

In early rural America, this duty was usually performed in late summer and was an occasion for family reunions and picnics.

After the Civil War, America's need for a secular, patriotic ceremony to honor our military dead became as monuments to fallen prominent, soldiers were erected and dedicated. and ceremonies centering on the decorations of soldier's graves were held in cities and towns thru-out the nation.

No less than 25 places have been named in connection with the origin of Memorial Day, and for many years, states observed the holiday on different dates. However, by federal law, Memorial Day is now celebrated on the last Monday in May which will be Monday, May 25th.

Oil 'n Gas Complaints

With the increase of oil and gas drilling activities in and around Blanchard, comes an increase in complaints of trucks, noise and odor.

All drilling activities complaints are to be reported directly to the Oklahoma Corporation Commission at 580-255-0103 (Duncan Field Ofc) or <u>http://www.occeweb.com/AspxForms/O</u> <u>GComplaintForm.aspx</u>.

The Oklahoma Supreme Court ruled 2018 Case in November in No. 117,303, Oklahoma Oil & Gas Association (Petitioner) ۷. The Kingfisher County Commissioners, (Respondents), that clarified "Further, a legal challenge to the reasonableness of a rule or regulation imposed by a municipality, county or other political subdivision concerning road use. traffic, noise and odors incidental to oil and gas operations within their boundaries shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission, 52 O.S. Supp. 2015, §137,1,"

The Oklahoma Corporation Commission (OCC) reported NO permits for oil and gas drilling were issued within the City limits of Blanchard this week.

The OCC is the only state agency that issues permits for oil and gas drilling.

Proclamation

A new Emergency Proclamation to implement Phase 2 approved and signed by the Mayor with an effective today (Friday, May 15th).

This Proclamation allows the following businesses to reopen in Blanchard:

• <u>Bars, Taverns, Nightclubs and Other</u> <u>Drinking Establishments</u> primarily serving alcoholic beverages can open using CDC recommended social distancing and sanitation protocols and following the Oklahoma Department of Commerce guidelines.

• <u>Festivals, Fairs, and other Outdoor</u> <u>Gatherings</u>, if they adhere to CDCrecommended social distancing and sanitation protocols and following the Oklahoma Department of Commerce guidelines. • <u>Organized games, competitions, and</u> <u>tournaments</u> may resume. This also includes tumbling/cheer/gymnastics facilities, dance studios, ice/roller skating rinks, and swimming schools.

• Larger weddings may resume with appropriate social distancing guidelines in place. Individuals should consult with weddina the venues to ensure appropriate social distancing and the maximum number of guests. They could offer seating with 6-feet distance between family and/or groups alternating rows or pews. Wedding ceremony venues should follow guidance for places of worship. Wedding reception venues should follow guidance for restaurants.

Larger funerals may resume with appropriate social distancing guidelines in place. Individuals should consult with the venues to ensure appropriate social distancing and the maximum number of quests. They could offer seating with 6-feet distance between family groups alternatina and/or rows bews. or Funeral service venues should follow guidance for places of worship. Funeral reception venues should follow guidance for restaurants.

• <u>Homeowners Associations</u>. It is up to the individual HOAs to determine when they want to organize HOA events. They should follow social distancing guidelines for any events organized.

• <u>Community Pools</u>. It is up to the neighborhoods to determine when they wish to reopen community pools. They should follow sanitation and social distancing best practices.

• <u>Common Areas</u>. It is up to the individual apartment community to determine how they wish to use the common areas. They should follow sanitation and social distancing best practices.

• <u>Garage sales</u> may resume, during Phase 2 of the OURS plan. Groups are should limited to 50 people, be outdoors. and allow social for distancina.

In-person auctions may resume, during Phase 2 of the OURS plan. Groups are limited to 50 people, should be outdoors, and allow for social distancing.

• These businesses shall post the CDCrecommendations and the Oklahoma Department of Commerce guidelines for their customers to read.

everyone that severe storm season is fast approaching. We want to express how important it is for everyone to register their home's storm shelters and safe rooms. The City of Blanchard storm shelter registry provides emergency services with information that allows them to locate citizens

after tornado or other ٥ natural Registration helps disaster. ensure that people in shelters affected by the storm are able to get help quickly with the potential of shelters' exits being blocked due to debris or structural Registration doubly damage. is important with the possibility of shelters flooding due to broken water lines or simply rain waters entering the shelter and drowning people trapped inside. Registration forms include your address, list of persons who would normally be present at the home and could potentially be in the shelter, the location of the shelter/safe room on the property, and contact information for yourself and an emergency contact. If you have previously registered and some part of your information has changed, feel free to submit an updated form. If you have a question as to if your shelter is registered please contact the Emergency Management **Director/Fire** Chief Charlie Largent at the Blanchard Fire Department at 405.485.3939.

Trash Service

The City contracts with Waste Connections for solid waste collection and disposal of residential trash. For a smooth operation, the following rules should be adhered to:

✓ Carts need to be set out by 7am;

✓ Carts need to be by the road, at the edge of the driveways, not in the driveway;


✓ If you have multiple carts they need to be 3 feet apart;

✓ Carts need to be 5 to 7 feet from mailbox, cars, etc;

✓ If carts are placed with wheels toward the house they are less likely to blow over;

✓ No bungee cords, straps, or rope to be placed on your cart, if it is windy, you can place a rock or brick on the lid to keep it closed;

✓ No limbs or trees or hazardous materials in either polycart.

The Blanchard Planning Commission held a Public Hearing on Thursday, May 14th at 6:30 p.m. to solicit general comments on the approval or denial of an application to re-zone property from the S-1 District to the R-E District filed by Richard and Kathleen Henderson for property located on Morgan Road in Grady County.

After hearing no opposition to the proposed zoning, the Planning Commission voted to recommend approval to the City Council.

However, the Zoning Case will not be heard by the City Council until the June meeting on June 23rd at the earliest.
