Autumnal Equinox

Fall begins Tuesday, September 22nd at



8:31p.m. CST. The Autumnal Equinox is defined as the point at which the

Sun appears to cross the celestial equator from north to south. The celestial equator is the circle in the celestial sphere halfway between the celestial poles. Another definition of fall is nites of below-freezing temperatures combined with day of temperatures below 70 degrees Fahrenheit. The word equinox means "equal nite"; nite and day are the same length of time. The equinoxes are times when the Sun's apparent motion undergoes the most rapid change. Around the time of the equinoxes, variations in the position on the horizon when the Sun rises and sets can be noticed from one day to the next by alert observers.

Citizenship Day

Constitution called Day, Citizenship Day will be observed on Thursday, September 17th. However, September 17th marks the anniversary of the date in 1787 when the final draft of the Constitution of the United States was

signed by delegates to the Constitutional Convention after months of wrangling. The framers had been arguing constantly as they met in secret, but they had leaked reports to the press indicating that all was well. The Federalists [as they were called] argued thru June and most of July and reached an agreement on July 16. After deciding to leave out a bill of rights - because everyone was worn-out and they thought there was no need for such a list - the framers completed the final draft on September 17 and made it ready for submission to the states for ratification.

Constitution Week

Constitution Day and Citizenship Day is a combined event that is annually observed in the United States on September 17. This event commemorates the formation and signing of the Constitution of the United States on September 17, 1787. It also recognizes all who, by coming of age or by naturalization, have become US citizens.

The Mayor will proclaim the week of September 13 – 19 for observance of National Constitution Week.

Hazardous Waste

Plans are underway to schedule a Hazardous Waste Collection event in October. Details are being worked out with the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ) and will be presented to the City Council on September 22nd for formal approval.

Items that will be accepted will include tires, batteries, oil, paints, old electronics, etc.

After Council approval, final information will be sent to all citizens in the October utility billing.

Health Testing

The Health Department located on North Main Street in Blanchard provides COVID testing on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9am to 10am and every other Fridays.

Holiday Observance

City offices are closed on Monday, September 7th for Labor Day.

If you have a Police or Fire emergency, please call 911. If you have a water or sewer emergency, please call 485-9391. The Dispatch Office will contact public works personnel who are on-call.

City offices will reopen Tuesday, September 8th at 8am. Trash service as scheduled.

Hotel-Motel Tax

A question for or against a proposed hotel-motel tax for Blanchard will be on the General Election on Tuesday, November 3rd.

HOW WILL THIS TAX BE COLLECTED?

The lodging provider will collect the tax at the time the bill is paid.

HOW WILL THE FUNDS BE USED?

Revenues will be "earmarked" in a separate fund to be used to promote Blanchard in promoting tourism.

The City is recruiting hotels and motels to locate in Blanchard. Part of the pro forma calculations is the amount of lodging tax charged in a community. This determines the feasibility of a hotelmotel, rates and number of rooms.

Permits Required

Residents may experience an increase in door-to-door sales associates. If you do encounter a solicitor at your door, they are required to have a permit from the City of Blanchard. These permits are required because they allow the City to perform background checks on applicants, which then allows the City to approve or deny the permit request. Not only are solicitors required to carry the permit on them at all times, they are also restricted to go door-to-door from 9 8 p.m., Monday through a.m. to Saturday. Residents who wish to have no interaction with solicitors are asked to display "No Solicitation Allowed" or "No Peddlers Allowed" sign that can be easily visible. If you suspect that a person in your neighborhood is soliciting without a permit, please call the Blanchard Police Department at 405.485.9391.

Tall Grass & Weeds

The City of Blanchard is committed to maintaining attractive clean and residential neighborhoods. help То accomplish this goal, the City of Blanchard has adopted regulations concerning the abatement of tall grass, weeds and trash.

The City of Blanchard Municipal Code concerning public nuisances and property enhancement requires that owners or responsible persons of property located within the municipal city limits are prohibited from allowing debris, junk, waste or trash to accumulate, or weeds or tall grass over twelve (12") inches in height, dead trees, bushes, and shrubs to grow or stand upon the premises. This regulation is based upon the Oklahoma State Law Title 11, Section 22-111 which sets forth the procedure and definitions for the cleaning and mowing of property.

This month is the last chance to be counted in the federal census!

Therefore, we need your help!!! The 2020 Census response rate is drastically low! To date, only 67% of Blanchard citizens have responded. Many of you may have not replied due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

To help improve our response rate, the City is opening the old City Hall at 114 W Broadway on Wednesday, September 9th from 9:00 AM until Noon, to anyone in our area who has not yet been counted in the 2020 census. There will be volunteers on hand, wearing masks, to assist you in filing this critical paperwork. Critical community services, such as the school district, police, fire and other related funding, will be drastically cut if we do not get a more accurate head count. At the current response rate, we stand to lose as much as over four million dollars annually for the next 10 years, if we do not get a more accurate census count.

However, you can still go online today at <u>www.2020census.gov.</u> Click on the "RESPOND" button and simply follow the questions to complete the report electronically. The national deadline is scheduled for the end of this month (September 30th), so please complete this ASAP!
