#### Bid Award

The Blanchard Municipal Improvement Authority received four (4) sealed bids to replace approximately 360 LF of existing 8-inch sanitary sewer line.

A contract is anticipated to be awarded to Urban Contractors LLC for being the lowest responsive bidder in the amount of \$56,841, as recommended by the City Engineer.

#### Oil 'n Gas Complaints

With the increase of oil and gas drilling activities in and around Blanchard, comes an increase in complaints of trucks, noise and odor.

All drilling activities complaints are to be reported directly to the

Oklahoma Corporation Commission at 580-255-0103 (Duncan Field Ofc) or 405-521-2111 (OKC).

The Oklahoma Department of Health is the official agency to investigate all noise complaints. Their number to call is 405-271-5779.

The Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality is the authorized agency to investigate all air and water quality complaints to include odor. Their complaint hot line is 1-800-522-0206.

Trucking complaints (speeding, signs, etc) are to be filed with the Blanchard Police Department at 405-485-9392.

### Oil 'n Gas Permits

The Oklahoma Corporation Commission (OCC) reported NO permits for oil and gas drilling were issued within the City limits of Blanchard this week.

The OCC is the only state agency that issues permits for oil and gas drilling.



#### Senior Assistance

ASCOG gratefully received a check from the Masonic Charity Foundation for \$64,158 at the December meeting Oklahoma **Association** the Regional Councils (OARC). The funds will be used in 2020 to assist those in need who are at least 55 years old residing in ASCOG's 8-county region Comanche, Cotton, (Caddo, McClain, Stephens, Jefferson, Tillman). Typical types of assistance include funding of up to \$800 for ADA approved ramps, dental work including dentures. hearing aids, wheelchairs,

scooters, lift chairs, durable medical equipment, minor home repairs, failing home appliances, heaters. conditioners. #### Winter Water Conservation

While we might not be watering our lawn or maintaining much of garden during these winter months, there are still ways to cut back on our water usage in the chilly months! A big part of using less water in the winter is anticipating the cold weather's effects on your home and on your pipes.
