#### 2021 American Rescue Plan Act

President Biden signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. It provides \$130.2 billion for local governments. Under the bill, local governments of every size will receive dedicated allotments.

Tentatively, the City of Blanchard is scheduled to receive an estimated \$1,430,000. However, these are just estimated amounts based on our population. Our annual budget will be considered in the final amount. Currently the data does not contain local budget information, so it does not reflect instances where we would reach a cap of 75% of its most recent budget as of January 27, 2020. The use of the funds are restricted.

The U.S. Senate passed a version that adds as eligible categories for use of these funds investing in water, sewer and broadband infrastructure. In addition:

• The Senate added a requirement that, to be authorized under this section, monies must be spent by December 31, 2024.

• The Senate added a requirement that the funding for localities be distributed in two tranches.

### Rate Case

Public Service Company of Oklahoma filed a Notice of Intent with the Oklahoma Corporation Commission advising regulators the Company will file for a change in customer rates.

• In a previous case, PSO agreed to file a base rate case between October 2020 and October 2021.

• PSO has made substantial investments and incurred increased expenses that are not included in current rates, which are based on 2018 costs.

By OCC rule, the Notice is simply a way to notify the OCC 45 days in advance of PSO's future application, which will be filed on or around April 30, 2021 with more details and testimony.

Real ID



Oklahoma has recently begun distributing licenses which will satisfy the REAL ID standards for Oklahoma

residents. In October all persons boarding

commercial planes or entering federal facilities, including military bases, will be required to present a REAL ID compliant card. If you already hold a passport or military ID then your identification will meet these standards. State residents are not required to obtain an Oklahoma REAL ID. However, if you plan to fly, even on domestic airlines, federal law requires that you must possess a REAL ID compliant license. #### Tax Payment Deadline

Oklahomans now have until June 15, 2021 to pay their 2020 individual and business income taxes, and their first guarter 2021 estimated income tax payments. As a result of the recent disaster declaration issued by FEMA, the IRS announced the tax deadline extension for all individuals who reside or own a business in all of Oklahoma's 77 counties to provide relief for those affected by February's historic **Following** winter storms. the the IRS. the announcement from Oklahoma Tax Commission ordered the payment deadline extension to provide further relief to Oklahoma taxpayers. The Oklahoma Tax Commissioners elected to adjust the payment deadline extension from April 15 to June 15 for all individuals that reside or own a business in Oklahoma.
