Animal Cruelty Prevention Month



Preventing animal cruelty starts with responsible pet ownership. Cruelty may include but not limited to animal *neglect* of unreasonable deprivation of

necessary food, care or shelter or *inhumane treatment* includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Any physical punishment inconsistent with the health of such animal;
- Lack of food or water for more than a twenty-four (24) hour period;
- Knowingly permitting obvious nutritional deficiencies or other evident health problems involving any animal;
- Improper use of any collar or harness or a fixed leash for the purpose of confining any animal which results in flesh laceration, obvious pain or to cause choking to such animal;
- Depriving animal of adequate shelter; and
- Inhumane killing or attempting to kill any animal.

You can report instances of animal cruelty to the City of Blanchard to be investigated by calling 485-9392.

Close to Home

The City met with the Oklahoma Wildlife Department regarding participating in the "Close to Home" program by stocking the existing pond in Crystal Lake with fish on a semi-annual basis. This will allow us to offer an annual Fishing Derby to Blanchard kids under the age of 16 which is cosponsored by Walmart and Zebco.

Upon executing an agreement with ODA, the City will be given 300 fish to initially stock the paid. Another part of the program would entitle the City the opportunities to be involved in grant sharing with the state, providing items to include construction of a fishing dock, fountains (aerators) and fish feeders and other items such as a gazebo, park benches, foot bridge. All we have to do is agree to maintain the perimeter of the pond, which we already do and allow the state to put up a few signs stating what type of fish that has been stocked and announcing the program.

In addition, we have ordered twenty-four (24) solar lights for placement along the trail so they are lit at night for safety.

Fair Housing Month

April is 'Fair Housing Month' in Blanchard. The City encourages each citizen to implement the provisions of the City's Fair Housing Ordinance and requests that any person, or group of persons, planning activities to promote fair housing to inform the City Clerk of such activities. A copy of the Ordinance may be obtained from the Office of the City Clerk.

IRS Tax Deadline

The Treasury Department and Internal Revenue Service announced today that the federal income tax filing due date for individuals for the 2020 tax year will be automatically extended from April 15, 2021, to May 17, 2021. The IRS will be providing formal guidance in the coming days.

Individual taxpayers can also postpone federal income tax payments for the 2020 tax year due on April 15, 2021, to May 17, 2021, without penalties and interest, regardless of the amount owed. This postponement applies to individual taxpayers, including individuals who pay self-employment tax. Penalties, interest and additions to tax will begin to accrue on any remaining unpaid balances as of May 17. 2021. Individual taxpayers will automatically avoid interest and penalties on the taxes paid by May 17.

Individual taxpayers do not need to file any forms or call the IRS to qualify for this automatic federal tax filing and payment relief. Individual taxpayers who need additional time to file beyond the May 17 deadline can request a filing extension until Oct. 15 by filing Form 4868 through their tax professional, tax software or using the Free File link on IRS.gov. Filing Form 4868 gives taxpayers until October 15 to file their 2020 tax return but does not grant an extension of time to pay taxes due. Taxpayers should pay their federal income tax due by May 17, 2021, to avoid interest and penalties.

The IRS urges taxpayers who are due a refund to file as soon as possible. Most tax refunds associated with e-filed returns are issued within 21 days.

Real ID

Oklahoma has recently begun distributing licenses which will satisfy the REAL ID standards for Oklahoma residents. In October all persons boarding commercial planes or entering federal facilities, including military bases, will be required to present a REAL ID compliant card. If you already hold a passport or military ID then your identification will meet these standards. State residents are not required to obtain an Oklahoma REAL ID. However, if you plan to fly, even on domestic airlines, federal law requires that you must possess a REAL ID compliant license. Tax Payment Deadline

Oklahomans now have until June 15, 2021 to pay their 2020 individual and business income taxes, and their first quarter 2021 estimated income tax payments. As a result of the recent disaster declaration issued by FEMA, the IRS announced the tax deadline extension for all individuals who reside or own a business in all of Oklahoma's 77 counties to provide relief for those affected by February's historic winter storms. Following the announcement from the IRS, the Oklahoma Tax Commission ordered the payment deadline extension to provide further relief to Oklahoma taxpayers. The Oklahoma Tax Commissioners elected to adjust the payment deadline extension from

April 15 to June 15 for all individuals that reside or own a business in Oklahoma.

Due dates for other tax types, including sales and withholding, remain the same. For more information, visit the Oklahoma Tax Commission website.

Veterans Memorial

The Veterans Committee has raised over \$120 thousand to date or 45.04% needed for the construction of the Memorial.

Construction will begin soon. The Navy Seabees stationed at Tinker AFB have agreed to provide manpower in its construction but are forbidden to use government equipment. Their labor will include plumbers, electricians, concrete finishers, etc. which will save the City thousands of dollars. The Committee has to provide the materials and necessary equipment.
