## Burn Ban

McClain County Commissioners have issued a 14-day burn ban for the county in response to high fire danger as verified by McClain County fire chiefs.

This ban is effective immediately and prohibits all fires, campfires, bonfires, burning trash or other materials due to the tinder dry conditions.
