Animal Cruelty Prevention Month



Preventing animal cruelty starts with responsible pet ownership. The month of April is Animal Cruelty Prevention Month. Cruelty may include but not limited to animal neglect of

unreasonable deprivation of necessary food, care or shelter or inhumane treatment includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- ♦ Any physical punishment inconsistent with the health of such animal:
- ◆ Lack of food or water for more than a twenty-four (24) hour period;

- ♦ Knowingly permitting obvious nutritional deficiencies or other evident health problems involving any animal;
- ◆ Improper use of any collar or harness or a fixed leash for the purpose of confining any animal which results in flesh laceration, obvious pain or to cause choking to such animal;
- ♦ Depriving animal of adequate shelter; and
- ♦ Inhumane killing or attempting to kill any animal.

You can report instances of animal cruelty to the City of Blanchard to be investigated by calling 485-9392.

Memorial Day

REMEMBER THOSE WHO SERVED



The custom of honoring our ancestors by cleaning

ALL GAVE SOME, SOME GAVE ALL

cemeteries and decorating graves is an ancient and worldwide tradition, but the specific origin of Memorial Day, or Decoration Day as it was first known, are unclear.

In early rural America, this duty was usually performed in late summer and was an occasion for family reunions and picnics.

After the Civil War, America's need for a secular, patriotic ceremony to honor our military dead became prominent, as monuments to fallen soldiers were erected and dedicated, and ceremonies centering on the decorations of soldier's graves were held in cities and towns thru-out the nation.

No less than 25 places have been named in connection with the origin of Memorial Day, and for many years, states observed the holiday on different dates. However, by federal law, Memorial Day is now celebrated on the last Monday in May which will be Monday, May 30th.

Mother's Day

Sunday, May 8th will be Mother's Day. Although the custom of setting aside a day to honor mothers has ancient roots, our observance of Mother's Day originated in 1907 with the efforts of a devoted daughter, Anna M. Jarvis of Philadelphia, who conceived the idea of an annual nationwide celebration. The public and the press quickly embraced the idea, villages, towns, cities, and states soon began unofficial Mother's Day observances. On May 8, 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation designating the second Sunday in May Mother's Day, and within a few years, the idea gained worldwide prominence. The day is now characterized by gift giving, sending greeting cards and flowers, and giving mother a "day off" by taking the family out to eat. In the United States, Mother's Day is celebrated on the second Sunday of May.

Shelter Registration



The Blanchard Emergency Management wants to remind everyone that severe storm season is fast approaching.

We express how important it is for everyone to register their home's storm shelters and safe rooms. The City of Blanchard storm shelter registry provides emergency services with information that allows them to locate citizens after a tornado or other natural disaster. Registration helps ensure that people in shelters affected by the storm are

able to get help quickly with the potential of shelters' exits being blocked due to debris or structural damage. Registration is doubly important with the possibility of shelters flooding due to broken water lines or simply waters entering the shelter and drowning people trapped inside. Registration forms include your address, list of persons who would normally be present at the home and could potentially be in the shelter, the location of the shelter/safe room on the property, and contact information yourself and an emergency contact. If you have previously registered and some part of your information has changed, feel free to submit an updated form. If you have a question as to if your shelter is registered Blanchard please contact the Fire Department at 405.485.3939.

Tornado Safety



In Oklahoma, tornados are most frequent in the spring and summer months. An average of 800 tornados are

reported each year, causing 80 deaths and over 1,500 injuries per year. These storms are capable of tremendous destruction with wind speeds of 250 mph or greater. The following guidelines will assist in keeping you safe:

Tornado Watch - means a tornado is "possible". When the National Weather Service issues a warning, it is time to turn on a TV or radio, look out the window from time to time, and be more alert to what is happening outside.

Tornado Warning – means that a tornado has actually been spotted, or is strongly indicated on radar, and it is time to go to a safe shelter immediately.

Warning Signs - A sickly greenish or greenish black color to the sky.

- » If there is a tornado warning or watch posted, then the fall of hail should be considered as a real danger.
- » A strange quiet that occurs within or shortly after the thunderstorm.

- » Clouds moving by very fast, especially in a rotating pattern or converging toward one area of the sky.
- » A sound a little like a waterfall or rushing air at first, then turning into a roar as it comes closer.
- » Tornados usually move from southwest to northeast.

Possible Shelters - Basements.

- » Interior rooms or hallways on the lowest floor.
- Small rooms restooms, closets, etc.Avoid rooms with wide span roof areas.
- » Get under a piece of sturdy furniture heavy table, cubicle work surface, etc.
- » Stay away from exterior walls, windows, mirrors, items hanging overhead.
- » Do not stay in vehicles.
- » If no other shelter is available, lay down in a depression in the ground, such as a ditch.
- » Use your arms to protect your head and neck

Veterans Memorial

The Veterans Memorial construction will resume very soon! The construction has been delayed several times, due to the weather and the loss of one of our sub-contractors. Now we are excited that a local company, RBI Industries, has agreed to provide "inkind" labor for the work needed to get the foundations installed. As soon as this is completed, we have the masonry workers scheduled to lay the foundation blocks for the Memorial wall, the four (4) Honor Pillars and the visitor's bench. We still plan to have

it ready for a dedication ceremony on Saturday, November 12th, immediately following the Veterans Parade. We will accomplish this extremely aggressive and an optimistic goal.

All funds for construction are being provided only through the individual honor bricks purchases along with the sponsorship donations from businesses and corporations. The City is only functioning as the legal guardian of these funds. Also, under IRS regulations, this allows all donations made to this project, to be fully tax deductible.

Remember, recognition is open to ALL veterans, regardless of where they are from, whether they are alive or deceased, where they live or when they might be interred. We also still have room for sponsorship panel donations to recognize your company or business permanently in the Sponsor's Pillar.
