Watering Odd-Even



Oklahoma City's oddeven watering rotations permanent and has been in place since 2013. It eases the summer-time demand on their water treatment system. These restrictions apply to Blanchard residents since we receive one-hundred

(100) percent of our water from OKC. Addresses ending in a 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8, can water on any day that ends in an even number. Addresses ending in a 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9 can water on any day ending in an odd number. Most Oklahoma lawns don't need more than one (1) inch of water per week in the summer to maintain optimum health. Use a rain gauge to determine how much water your lawn is getting. Fewer, deeper watering ensures better root health. Visit www.squeezeeverydrop.com for details.
