## CDBG Public Hearing

The City of Blanchard will hold a Public Hearing on a proposed FY-2023 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) to fund Phase II to update and replace existing water lines in old town Blanchard.

The Hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, December 13<sup>th</sup>, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. at the Blanchard Municipal Courthouse located at 300 North Main Street, Blanchard, OK.

The Public meeting will provide citizens with information on:

» Type of projects for which funding is available.

» Identify needs and priorities.

» The amount of funds available.

» How much of the funding will be for low and moderate income.

» A timetable for implementation of proposed program when funded.

» Opportunity for comment on proposed activities.

» Discussion of proposed budget.

It is anticipated that the City will make an application to the State of Oklahoma Department of Commerce for CDBG Grant funds to carry out the proposed activities. All interested citizens are invited to attend this hearing. The application will be available from the City Clerk for review at the time of submission. The project serves the Blanchard Old Town Area.

# **Public Hearing**

The Blanchard City Council will conduct a public hearing at their regular meeting on Tuesday, December 13<sup>Th</sup> beginning at 6pm. The purpose of the hearing is to solicit public input regarding an application to the Oklahoma Department of Tourism and Recreation to fund certain park improvements.

The proposed application is seeking an 80-20 grant to fund approximately 5,280 L.F. of walking trails and pedestrian

## Winter Solstice



The winter solstice is one of the two times each year that the Sun is at its farthest point from the equator and appears to stand still. It occurs on Wednesday, December 21<sup>st</sup> at 3:48 p.m. CST.

The word *solstice* is derived from the Latin *sol*, or "Sun," and *stitium*, or "stoppage." The Halcyon Days also occur around this time. According to ancient legend, a grieving wife named Alcyone, or Halcyon, threw herself into the sea upon discovering the drowned body of her beloved husband, Ceyx. The gods took pity on the pair, transforming them into kingfishers with the power to still the stormy seas for 14 days around the time of the winter solstice while they built their nest and hatched their young.
