# Daylite Saving Time



When we change our clocks ... change our smoke detector batteries on March 12<sup>th</sup> when most of the United States begins Daylight Saving Time at 2:00 a.m. on the second Sunday in March (12<sup>th</sup>).

The country reverts back to standard time on the first Sunday in November. In the U.S., each time zone switches at a different time.

Three (3) bills were introduced in the Oklahoma Legislature in 2023 (SB7; SB69; HB2217), if passed, one would require daylight saving time to be observed the year-round (Passed Committee on a 8-2 vote; the 2<sup>nd</sup> will place the measure on a ballot referendum making Daylight Saving Time permanent; and the 3<sup>rd</sup> not observing Daylight Saving Time but adhere to Standard Time year around.

Tick Tock: Daylight-saving time isn't observed in Arizona or Hawaii.

February is Heart Health Month! Are you at risk for diabetes?



If so, you may also be at risk for heart disease. The American

Heart Association says 65 percent of people with diabetes die from some form of heart disease or stroke. Do you have diabetes? Some symptoms of diabetes to

look for include frequent urination, frequent hunger and thirst, blurry vision, feeling very tired, bruises and cuts that heal very slowly, unexplained weight loss, and numbness/tingling in the hands and feet. ## Vernal Equinox
