Action Required

Pioneer will be replacing the traditional copper wire network with fiber-optic technology! Your Pioneer service(s) must be moved to the fiber network BEFORE OCTOBER 16, 2023, OR YOU WILL NOT HAVE SERVICE FROM PIONEER.

E-Mail Newsletter

Pioneer provides service to your home over traditional copper wire network. They are in the final stages of upgrading their entire network with new fiber-optic technology. Fiber-optic technology can bring you additional services, and more reliable performance.

Fiber-optic technology uses cables made of glass or plastic strands that transmit light. This technology is more efficient than standard copper wiring. Fiber-optic technology can transfer more information, faster, with higher quality, and over greater distances. The fiber-optic cables aren't affected by electrical interference, making the upgraded network more reliable, and secure.

To maintain their fiber-optic networks as their primary network, they will terminate the existing copper network on October 16, 2023. Once the copper network has been terminated, if you have <u>NOT</u> converted to the fiber-optic network you will <u>NOT</u> have service. Please visit the local Pioneer office or call 405.387.8155 to speak to a representative about getting upgraded to the new fiber network.

If you already have Pioneer Internet service, your current Internet plan will be upgraded to one of their fiber plans, providing you with upgraded features like: symmetrical download and upload speeds, enhanced experience, and more reliable service. Plus, your internet equipment will also upgraded to their newest gateway, which offers amazing WiFi 6 technology providing increased coverages and enhanced WiFi performance.

House Numbering

In an emergency, first responders (fire, police and ambulance) and utility service technicians depend on clearly marked addresses to find the right home as quickly as possible. Finding a residence can be challenging if street addresses (house numbers) are unreadable, hidden, unlit or missing. You can help emergency responders and service technicians locate your home by following these tips:

Replace aging or faded numbers;

• Clear all obstructions (hanging plants, bushes, flags, etc.) from blocking your house number;

• Post large numbers to allow visibility from the street;

 Place your numbers near the street or on the curb, with a reflective coating and contrasting background;

• Allow numbers to be seen from all directions (if your home is on a corner, have numbers posted on all sides).

The BMC §4-402 requires all building and houses to be numbered. The even numbers (2,4,6, etc.) shall be on the east side of the streets extending north and south, and on the south side of the streets extending east and west; the odd numbers (1,3,5, etc.) shall be on the opposite side of streets.

Memorial Poker Ride

The 4th Annual Veterans Memorial Poker Chip Run will be held in Blanchard, OK on October 21st. Registration time between 7am - 10 am at Old City Hall located at 114 West Broadway.

Any ties will be broken by drawing an additional poker chip.

On The Council-BMIA Agenda

The Blanchard City Council and BMIA Board of Trustees will hold a special joint meeting on Tuesday, October 10th beginning at 6pm to discuss, consider and take possible action re:

• Discussion and possible action on a motion to increase the Utility Rates for water/sewer/sanitation services due to increases with the cost of services from water providers (OKCWUT and City of Newcastle), sewer treatment costs and compliance with ODEQ Consent Order, and solid waste collection (Waste Connections). Action by the BMIA may include the adoption of a Resolution addressing utility fee increases and action by the City of Blanchard may include the adoption of a Resolution and/or an Ordinance changing utility rates, as desired.

• Discussion and a motion to approve an ODEQ Application for wastewater discharge, as requested by the City Engineer.

• Discussion and a motion to approve recommendations by the City Engineer regarding improvements to the OKC Booster Station.



The Blanchard Senior Nutrition Center serves a fully balanced lunch (entrees, sides, desserts, tea and coffee) for all senior citizens five (5) days a week beginning at 11:30am, Monday thru Friday. MENU (October 9th - 13TH)

Monday ~ Goulash, Carrots, Peas, Dessert. Tuesday ~ Smoked Sausage, Cabbage, Blackeyed Peas, Cornbread, Dessert.
