### Action Required

Pioneer will be replacing the traditional copper wire network with fiber-optic technology! Your Pioneer service(s) must be moved to the fiber network BEFORE OCTOBER 16, 2023, OR YOU WILL NOT HAVE SERVICE FROM PIONEER.

Pioneer provides service to your home over traditional copper wire network. They are in the final stages of upgrading their entire network with new fiber-optic technology. Fiber-optic technology can bring you additional services, and more reliable performance.

Fiber-optic technology uses cables made of glass or plastic strands that transmit light. This technology is more efficient than standard copper wiring. Fiber-optic technology can transfer more information, faster, with higher quality, and over greater distances. The fiber-optic cables aren't affected by electrical interference, making the upgraded network more reliable, and secure.

To maintain their fiber-optic networks as their primary network, they will terminate the existing copper network on October 16, 2023. Once the copper network has been terminated, if you have <a href="NOT">NOT</a> converted to the fiber-optic network you will <a href="NOT">NOT</a> have service. Please visit the local Pioneer office or call 405.387.8155 to speak to a representative about getting upgraded to the new fiber network.

If you already have Pioneer Internet service, your current Internet plan will be upgraded to one of their fiber plans, providing you with upgraded features like: symmetrical download and upload speeds, enhanced experience, and more reliable service. Plus, your internet equipment will also upgraded to their newest gateway, which offers amazing WiFi 6 technology providing increased coverages and enhanced WiFi performance.

#### Council-BMIA Action

The Blanchard City Council and BMIA Board of Trustees met in Joint Special meeting on Tuesday, October 10<sup>th</sup> and discussed, considered and took appropriate action re:

- Discussed increases to the Utility Rates for water/sewer/sanitation services due to increases with the cost of services from water providers (OKCWUT and City of Newcastle), sewer treatment costs and compliance with ODEQ Consent Order, and solid waste collection (Waste Connections).
- Approved a ODEQ Application for wastewater discharge, as requested by the City Engineer.
- Approved recommendations by the City Engineer regarding improvements to the OKC Booster Station.
- Helded Executive Session with NO action taken.

### Daylite Saving Time Ends

FALL BACK SUNDAY, November 5<sup>th</sup>, when Daylight Saving Time ends at 2 a.m. Clocks will "fall back" one-hour.

Credit for Daylite Saving Time belongs to Benjamin Franklin, who first suggested the idea in 1784. The idea was revised in 1907,



when William
Willett, an
Englishman,
proposed a similar
system in the
pamphlet 'The
Waste of Daylight'.

The Germans were the first to officially adopt the light extending system in 1915 as a

fuel-saving measure during World War 1. The British switched one year later, and the United States followed in 1918, when Congress passed the Standard Time Act, which established our time zones. This experiment lasted only until 1920, when the law was repealed



### House Numbering

In an emergency, first responders (fire, police and ambulance) and utility service



- Replace aging or faded numbers;
- Clear all obstructions (hanging plants, bushes, flags, etc.) from blocking your house number;
- Post large numbers to allow visibility from the street;
- Place your numbers near the street or on the curb, with a reflective coating and contrasting background;
- Allow numbers to be seen from all directions (if your home is on a corner, have numbers posted on all sides).

The BMC \$4-402 requires all building and houses to be numbered. The even numbers (2,4,6, etc.) shall be on the east side of the streets extending north and south, and on the south side of the streets extending east and west; the odd numbers (1,3,5, etc.) shall be on the opposite side of streets.

### Shop Local

Here's what happens when you "shop local."

- For every \$100 you spend at locally owned businesses, \$68 stays in Blanchard. What happens when you spend that same \$100 at a national chain? Only \$43 stays in the community.
- 2. You wouldn't want your house to look like everyone else's in the U.S. So why would you want your community to look that way?
- 3. Local businesses are better at creating higher-paying jobs for your neighbors. When you shop locally, you help create jobs for firemen, police officers, and many other essential professions.
- 4. Buying from a locally owned business conserves energy and resources in the form of less fuel for transportation and less packaging.
- 5. Local business owners know you, and you know them. Studies have shown that local businesses donate to community causes at more than twice the rate of chains.
- 6. Shopping in a local business district means less infrastructure, less maintenance, and more money available to beautify the community. Also, spending locally instead of online ensures that your sales taxes are reinvested where they belong in Blanchard.
